



DAYTONA BEACH INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT

Daytona Beach International Airport is located in Volusia County, about three miles west of downtown Daytona Beach. The airport has three runways, with the longest runway measuring 10,500 feet. The airport is capable of accommodating a full range of commercial and general aviation aircraft.



The airport is conveniently located for tourists traveling to Daytona Beach or to the Daytona International Speedway. The airport primarily supports business activity, recreational flying, and flight training. Most flight training operations originate from Embry-Riddle Aeronautical University, a premier aeronautical college located on the eastern edge of the airfield. The Daytona International Speedway is also adjacent to the airfield. This world-famous race track hosts multiple motor sports events throughout the year. In addition, the airport hosts numerous

community events, such as county meetings, community appreciation days, and chamber of commerce events.

Florida's Statewide Benefits From Aviation

Florida realizes significant economic benefits from aviation. The Florida Department of Transportation completed a comprehensive economic impact analysis to measure these benefits. Benefits measured in the FDOT study considered on-airport impacts, visitor spending impacts, and multiplier impacts.

Florida's 129 public-use airports (including 20 commercial service facilities) are a major economic engine of the State's economy. The aviation system keeps Florida connected to the global marketplace while simultaneously driving local economies. Florida's airports provide space and infrastructure for important activities such as manufacturing, logistics, tourism, and emergency response. Below is a summary of the total statewide economic impact as well as the impact of District 5.
