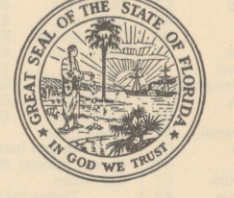





TRAFFIC SIGN SHAPES

-  this shape means **STOP**
This OCTAGON shape is used only for the stop sign, which means STOP and make sure the way is clear BEFORE PROCEEDING.
-  this shape means **a REGULATION**
The RECTANGULAR shape carries SPEED LIMITS, turning, passing and parking regulations.
-  this shape means **DANGER**
This DIAMOND shape always carries a warning of some HAZARD or unusual condition on the road ahead and calls for CAUTION and REDUCED SPEED.
-  these shapes mean **RAILROAD CROSSING**
The CIRCLE and the CROSSBICK mean the same thing: STOP-LOOK-LISTEN-RAILROAD CROSSING.
