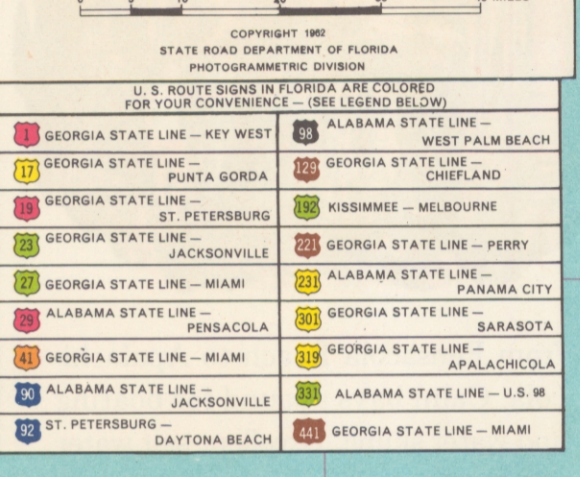

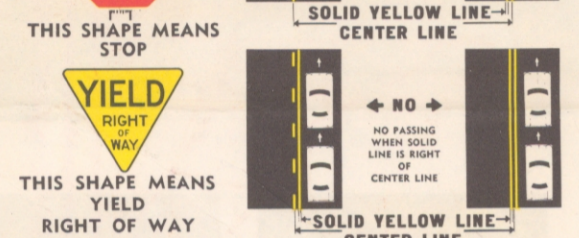


U. S. ROUTE SIGNS IN FLORIDA ARE COLORED FOR YOUR CONVENIENCE—SEE LEGEND BELOW

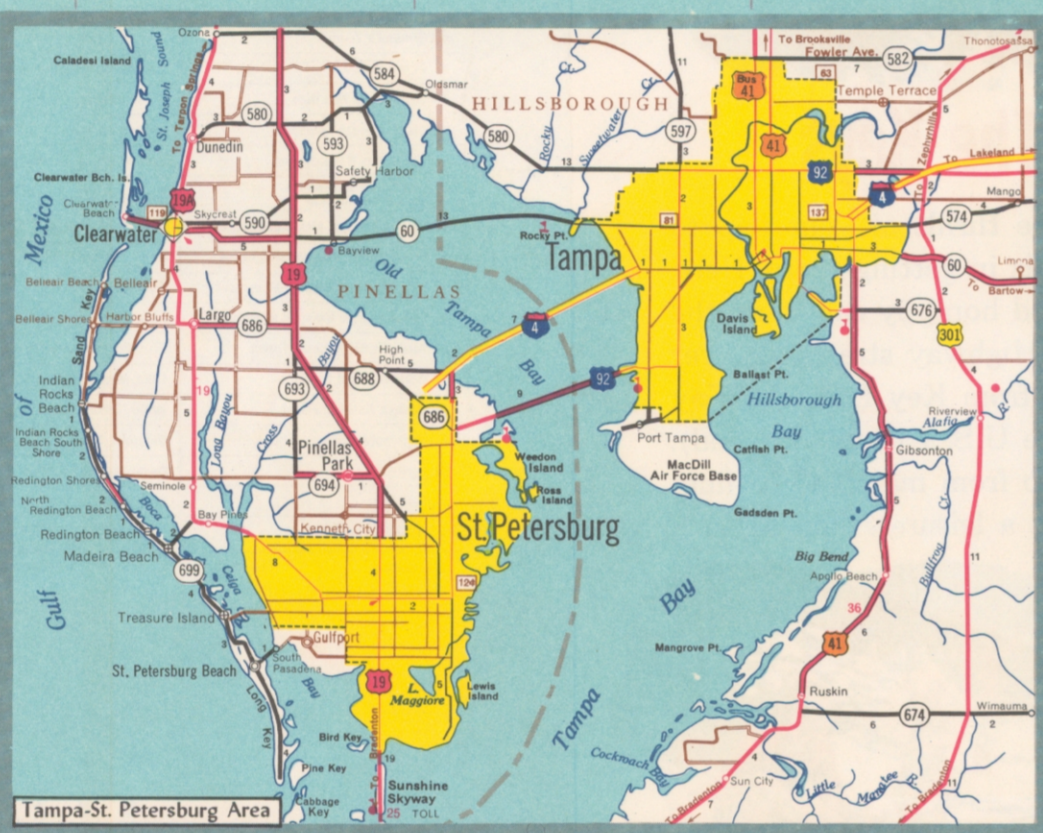
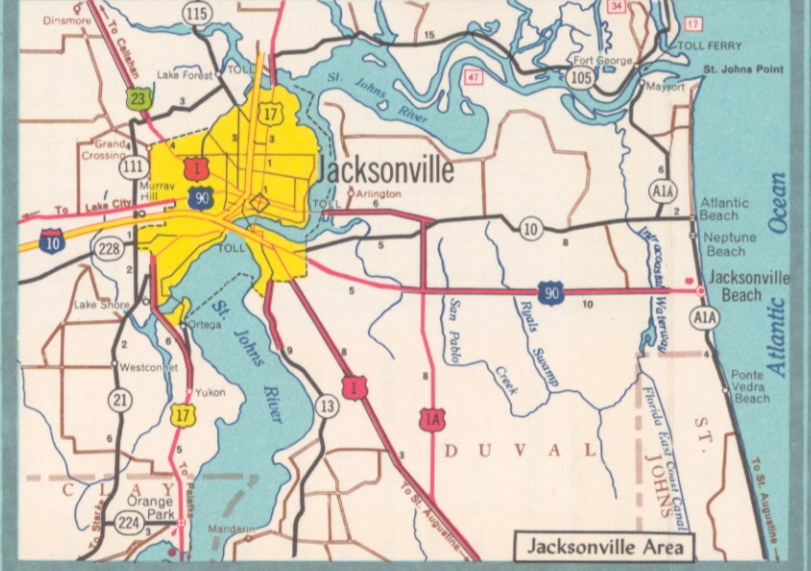
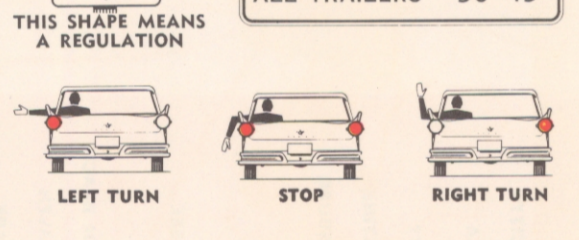
TRAFFIC SIGN SHAPES WHEN TO PASS



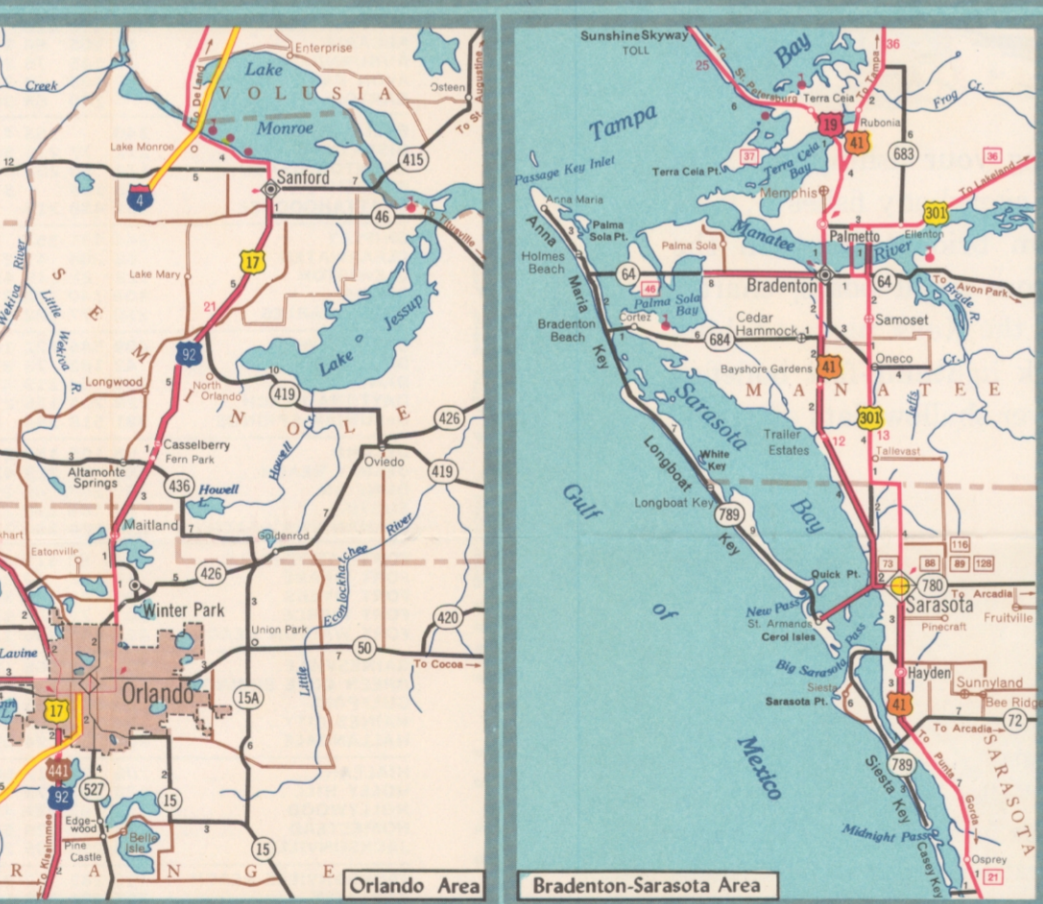
FLORIDA SCHOOL BUS LAW
All traffic must STOP when school buses are loading or unloading except when buses are on the opposite roadway of a divided highway which has an unpaved space of 5 feet or more or a physical barrier between the roadways.

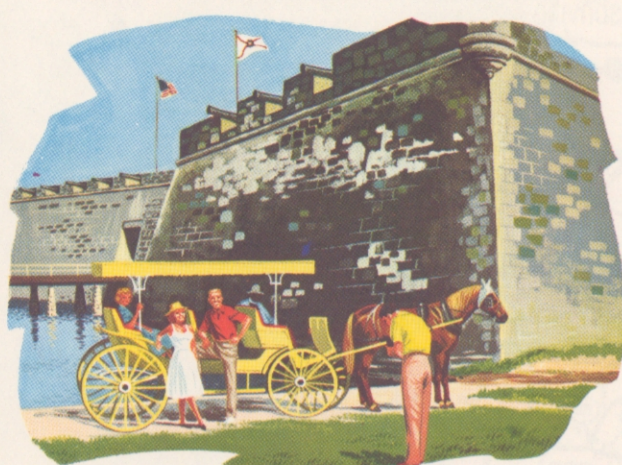
Visit all these 9 vacation regions



1 Northwest Florida

For years the family fun vacationland of all the South . . . now a favorite of Northerners, too. Famous for its Miracle Strip—dazzling white sand beaches that stretch for 100 miles along the Gulf of Mexico,

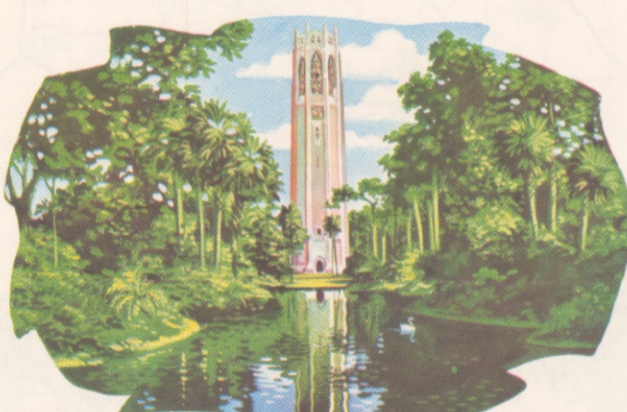
3 Upper East Coast



Historically, Florida began here . . . Here, Ponce de Leon sought his fountain of youth. Here is St. Augustine, oldest U.S. city. The area is dotted with reminders of Florida under Indian, Spanish, French and English rule. *Modern* Florida began here, too. Jacksonville, gateway to Florida, was the state's first community to achieve big-city size. Daytona Beach has been linked with speed records almost from the first days of the motor car.

5 Central Florida

Florida is a state of contrasts. Nowhere else is this so apparent as here in Florida's heartland. You are no more than 70 miles from a beach at any point, yet you'd never suspect it. This is rolling hill country, dotted with challenging golf courses. Thousands of lakes that range in size from mere ponds to many square miles invite you and your fishing gear. Here are Florida's largest citrus groves, great beef-cattle ranges—and some of Florida's best-known tourist attractions, such as the Bok Singing Tower.



6 Florida West Coast

Relaxation is the watchword on Florida's lower Gulf coast. An almost continuous chain of off-shore islands stretch from just below Tarpon Springs to Bonita Springs . . .



with beaches of fine white sand, protected waters, a placid surf. And, in addition to the fabulous beaches, such cities as Tampa, St. Petersburg, Clearwater, Bradenton, Sarasota, Fort Myers offer vacationists a hundred-and-one ways to have fun.

8 Lower East Coast

Vacationland of magic names . . . Miami and Miami Beach, Fort Lauderdale, Palm Beach, others. Here, you can live it up on a grand scale in a glamorous hotel or motel, or have fun on a budget at a casual family resort. Enjoy a gourmet meal in a famous restaurant—or a cook-out on the beach. Urge your favorites on at one of the nation's best-known thoroughbred tracks—or take an inexpensive trip by boat, bus or blimp. Listen to a name band at a night club—or attend a free band concert under the stars. Many top attractions are in this area. Here you set your pace to suit your taste and fit your budget.



from Pensacola Beach to Apalachicola. Calm bays abound for boating and water skiing. Excellent salt water and fresh water fishing . . . good hunting, too. Here, you'll find the famed Florida Caverns State Park.

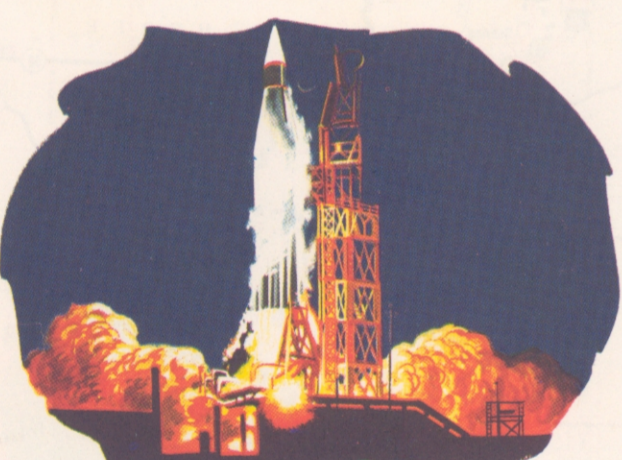
2 North Florida



Here, the outdoorsman's dreams come true. Dozens of lakes just jumping with fish. There's fresh-water fishing in the upper reaches of the rivers, salt water fishing where these streams near the Gulf. And there's wing shooting over the salt marshes . . . the widest imaginable variety of game in the vast forest. Tallahassee, state capital, is in this region. And you can cruise the Suwannee River, immortalized in song by Stephen Foster.

4 Indian River Region

Indian River is *not* a river, but a 100-mile-long salt water lagoon, from above Titusville to Jensen Beach. In the Indian River region was planted one of Florida's first citrus groves (around 1835). Today, Indian River grapefruit and oranges are world-famous. Famous, too, is the variety of fishing here (from surf-casting to deep-sea fishing by charter boat) . . . and, of course, Cape Canaveral, America's threshold of space.



7 The Everglades

"River of Grass," the Indians called the Everglades. Certainly this is like no other region on earth. Toward its south and southeast edge, land and water merge in a jungle of salt marshes, mangrove swamps and beaches. Lagoons and bays jump with tarpon, snook, sea trout, pompano. In the northwest—Lake Okechobee, second largest of the nation's fresh water lakes (where 10-pound bass are not exceptional!). Explore this vast tropic wilderness by airboat. Drive your car across it on the Tamiami Trail (U.S. 41). Take one of the Audubon Society's Everglades wildlife tours.



9 The Keys

One of the thrills of your trip to the Keys is in getting there. Here, you "island hop" by car — on the Overseas Highway stretching over 100 miles from Key Largo to Key West (take U.S. 1 to its very end). Entire trip from mainland to final stop takes a leisurely half-day.



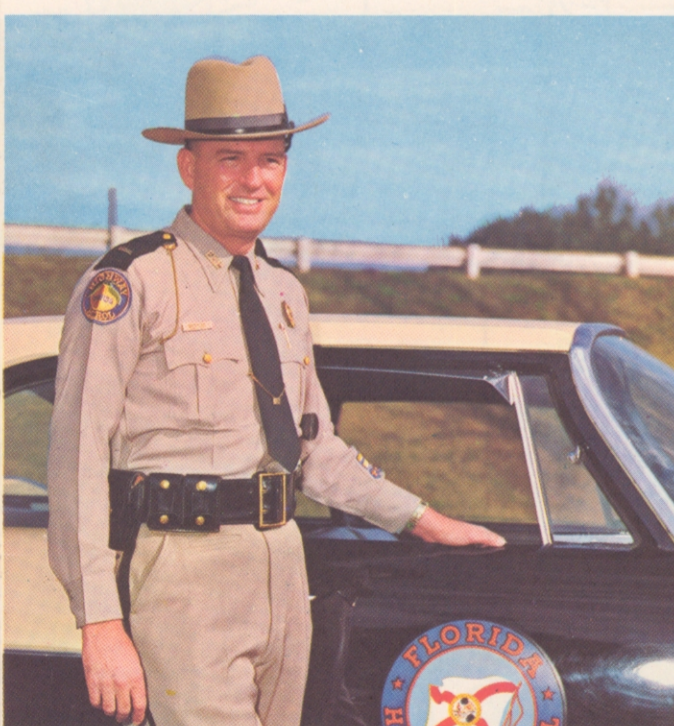
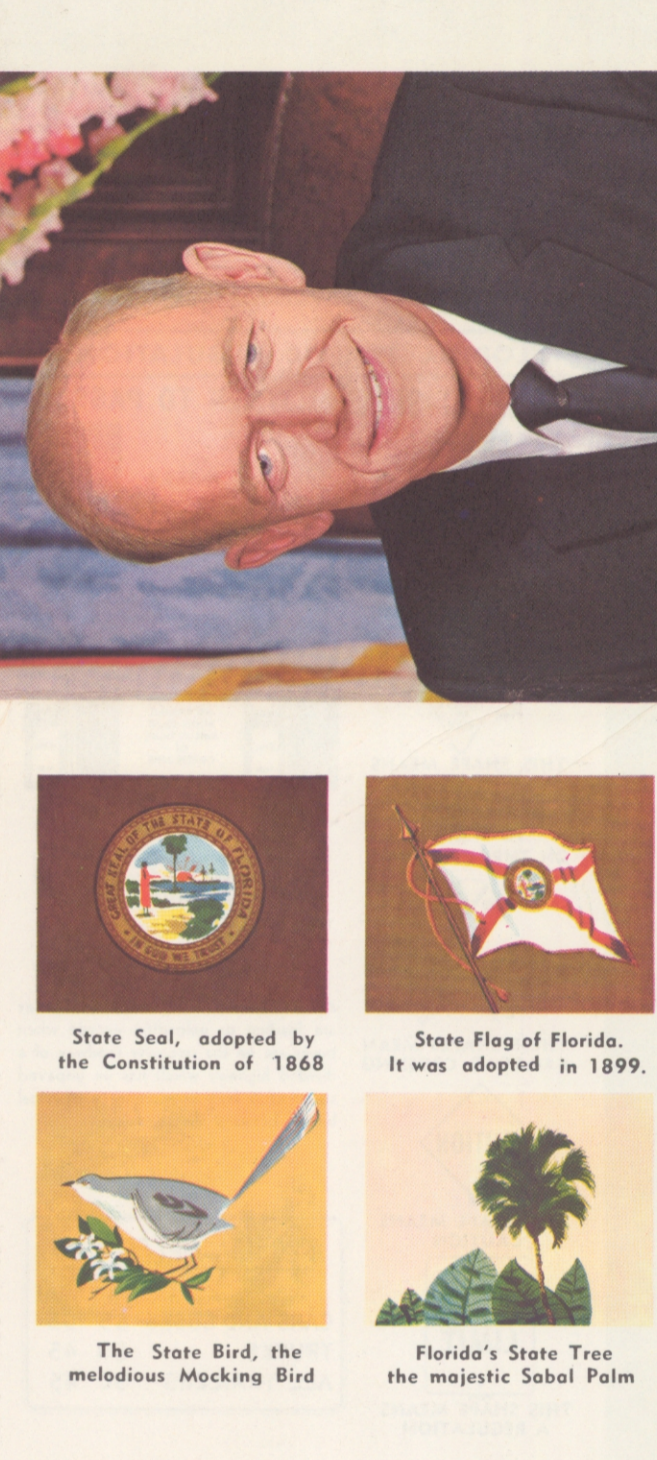
Bring along your fishing gear. On the Keys, everybody fishes . . . from piers, from bridges between the islands, from small boats, charter boats. For the Keys' biggest fishing thrill, stalk lightning-fast bonefish by boat over shallow flats off shore.

The Florida Highway Patrol

It's reassuring to know that Florida has 500 of these troopers and patrol stations at 30 locations. At these, as well as at Florida Welcome Stations near the state line, you can get travel information, free guide booklets, maps of Florida, and the Florida Drivers' Handbook.
