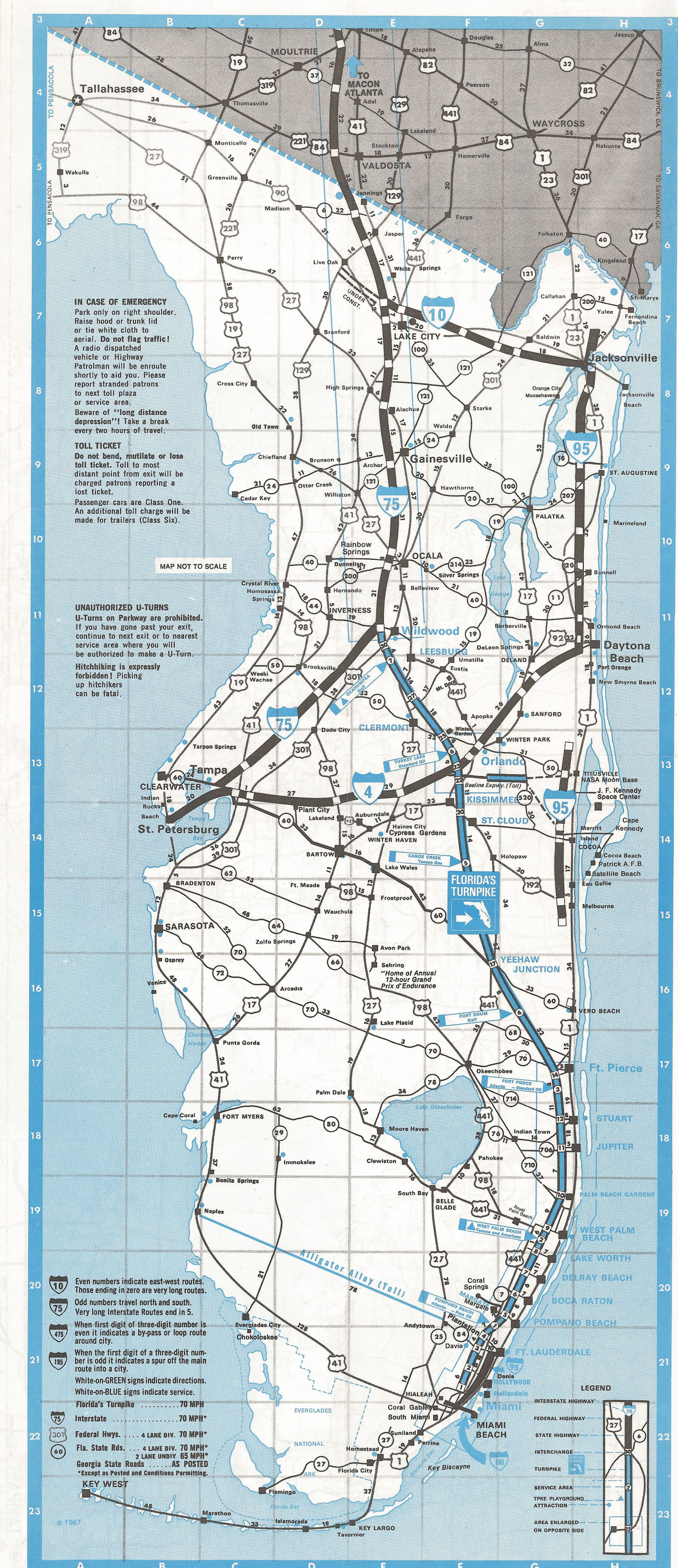

All traffic must STOP when school buses are loading or unloading except when buses are on the opposite roadway of a divided highway which has an unpaired space of 5 feet or more or a physical barrier between the roadways.
