INTERSTATE HIGHWAYS

- Principal routes: Red, white and blue signs with 1 or 2-digit numbers. East-west routes have even numbers. North-south routes have odd numbers.
- Loop or belt routes: These are circle or bypass routes. 3-digit numbers, first number even.
- Spur routes: These lead into cities. 3-digit numbers, first number odd.
- Business routes: Green signs. These are routes from principal, loop or belt highways, to or through cities.
