**General:** Mr. Leiby is a graduate of the University of Miami School of Law (J.D., 1973) and is of counsel to Malka & Kravitz, P.A. He began his law practice in construction law in 1973. He founded and was the first chair of the Construction Law Committee of the Florida Bar Real Property Section (1976-1994).
