Respond and be on site within one (1) hour to all emergency calls from the Department or Agency described by the Department as having authority to call the Contractor.

I don't think this needs to be an option for the scope. The criteria are clearly covered with the below performance measures and the referenced Open Roads Policy.

2.4 Specific Contractor Responsibilities for Other Emergencies

Other Emergencies are incidents/events that do not prompt the Governor of Florida to declare a State of Emergency in response to the incident/event. Other Emergencies will most commonly be traffic crashes, guardrail hits, severe potholes, debris within travel lanes, attenuator hits, roadway shoulder wash-outs, roadway cave-ins, facility damage and downed light poles but can include natural disasters/events/storms (Acts of God), collisions with structures/facilities and related components, and incidents/events resulting from human interactions.

Respond and deploy resources according to the goals established in the **Open Roads Policy**. Arrive onsite, prepared to take necessary action with necessary manpower and emergency response equipment. Working hours referenced under the Department responsibilities in the **Open Roads Policy** are defined as Monday through Friday 7:00 am to 5:30 pm. Be available to relieve Law Enforcement personnel of traffic control functions within fifteen (15) minutes of arriving onsite.

Florida Department of Transportations Responsibilities

When requested by FHP or other emergency agency, FDOT will respond and deploy resources to major traffic incidents 24 hours a day, 7 days per week. Each FDOT District will develop and implement response procedures to meet the goal of providing initial traffic control within **30 minutes** of notification during the assigned working hours of each maintenance yard, and **60 minutes** after hours.
