RESOLUTION NO. 72-76

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE PROPER CITY OFFICIALS TO EXECUTE A UTILITY RELOCATION MASTER AGREEMENT WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION COVERING ALL FUTURE STATE HIGHWAY PROJECTS INVOLVING THE ADJUSTMENT, CHANGE OR RELOCATION OF CITY OWNED AND OPERATED UTILITIES LOCATED ON PROPERTY IN WHICH THE CITY HOLDS NO COMPENSABLE INTEREST.

WHEREAS, the State of Florida Department of Transportation has requested the City to execute a Utility Relocation Master Agreement with the Department covering all future State Highway projects involving the adjustment, change or relocation of city owned and operated utilities located on property in which the City holds no compensable interest; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Master Agreement is to circumvent the current necessity of processing for legal execution a separate agreement for each individual State Highway project involving such relocations; and

WHEREAS, this Master Agreement contains the same terms and conditions as the prior agreements for individual projects and does not change any current liaison procedures between the Department and the City with respect to the development of the utility relocation plans and rescheduling;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF FORT LAUDERDALE, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. That the proper City officials are hereby authorized and directed to execute the Utility Relocation Master Agreement with the State of Florida Department of Transportation, covering all future State Highway projects involving relocation of City owned and operated utilities located on property in which the City holds no compensable interest, presented at this meeting and approved by the City Attorney.

SECTION 2. That the City Clerk be and is hereby directed to forward a certified copy of this Resolution to the State of Florida Department of Transportation at Tallahassee, Florida.
