This is a 7-year Asset Management Services. This project includes all sections and sub sections of State Road Corridors outlined in Broward County; State Road 862 (I595) from Mile Marker 9.056 to Mile Marker 12.86, State Road 9 (I95) from Mile Marker 0.00 to 25.307, State Road 84 Westbound Mile Maker 6.65 to 12.408, State Road 84 Eastbound from 0.0 to 5.81, State Road 93 (I75) from 0.0 to 17.993. Project includes Park & Rides (Sheridan, Broward Blvd, Commercial and Cypress Creek) and Rest Area.

This addendum includes changes as detailed below:

A. SCOPE OF SERVICES

1) In Objective Section of Scope under the main table labeled "Broward Asset Management Project Limits 195, 175, Portions of 595 & SR 84" page 4:

2) Replace Section 4.14 REST AREA MAINTENANCE with the following:

4.14 REST AREA AND RECREATIONAL AREAS MAINTENANCE

Broward County Rest Area shall be maintained to meet the performance requirements of applicable characteristics set forth in the MRP Handbook. The contractor shall include maintenance on the Rest Area in their Annual Work Plan. Contractor shall include maintenance to all Rest Area equipment and its appurtenances, (IE, Generators, Water Treatment Plant, Air

Conditioning, ect) in their Annual Maintenance plan. Area of maintenance includes Recreational Areas outlined in the Recreational Area table Objective Section and two (2) Boat Ramps. Detailed Map and information found in Informational CD under Rest Area.

3) Replace section <u>4.20 STRUCTURAL PROTECTIVE/DECORATIVE COATING MATERIALS</u> with the following:

4.20 STRUCTURAL PROTECTIVE/DECORATIVE COATING MATERIALS

Structural coating materials as identified in standard specification section 975 require routine maintenance to address failed coating systems up to 15 percent of the total coated surface area of the element or individual component/member. Failed Coating Systems are defined as follows:

- Failed coating system for Steel and Aluminum Element is defined as:
 - Corrosion (1000) in CS2 or greater
 - o Peeling, Bubbling, Cracking (3420) in CS2 or greater
 - Oxide Film Degradation Color, Texture Adherence (3430) in CS2 or greater
 - o Effectiveness-Steel Protective Coatings (3440) in CS3 or greater
 - Failed coating system for Concrete Element is defined as:
 - Wear-Concrete Protective Coatings (3510) in CS2 or greater
 - o Effectiveness-Concrete Protective Coating (3540) in CS3 or greater
 - Class V Finish Peeling and Bubbling of the coating

Maintain the coating system until the recoating project is let including the areas with failed coating and/or section loss. Examples of coating systems include but are not limited to; concrete coatings (class V, paint, anti-graffiti, etc.), steel coatings (galvanizing, paint, metalizing, etc.), aluminum coatings (paint, etc.).

B. RFP

1) The section 14.1.1 from the RFP is revised as follow:

14.1.1 PART I: TECHNICAL PROPOSAL – (Proposer Name) – (Contract Number)

Failure of the Proposer to follow this outline will result in the rejection of the Proposal Package. The submitted Technical Proposal will become a part of the Contract and the Contractor will be expected to adhere to commitments made in the Technical Proposal. Do not include any Price Proposal information in the Technical Proposal.

2) The section 14.1.2 from the RFP is revised as follow:

14.1.2 PART II: PRICE PROPOSAL - (Proposer Name) - (Contract Number)
