SCOPE OF SERVICES ASSET MAINTENANCE CONTRACT

CONTRACT ADMINISTRATION

Contract Number: E5V69

Financial Project Number (s): 445866-1-72-01

OBJECTIVE

This performance-based contract requires the inspection, management and performance of the maintenance of all components of the transportation facility as identified herein. Maintenance activities within the limits of this contract are to be performed by the Contractor, unless otherwise exempted in this contract. The Department will not direct specific work as in most traditional maintenance contracts. This performance-based contract requires the Contractor to determine the work needs, perform the work, and continually produce a quality product. The Department will evaluate the Contractor's quality of work performed both randomly and systematically. The Department is entrusting the Contractor to care for and maintain select roadways, structures, and facilities of Florida's state roads and expects the Contractor to take pride in performing a high level of maintenance. The continual quality of the maintenance of the roadways, structures, and facilities will be a direct reflection, under public scrutiny, of the quality and integrity of the Contractor. The roadways, structures, and facilities included in the scope of this contract are as follows:

The Wekiva Parkway project contains several segments which will be under construction at the beginning of this contract. The Contractor will not be responsible for maintenance of these segments of roadway until construction is complete and the segment is added to this contract by a Letter of Authorization.

1. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

1.1 Current Standards and Subsequent Updates

Perform all work to the most current Department Standards and Specifications, as may be updated throughout the life of the contract. Inspect, manage and consistently maintain all assets within the project limits as identified in this scope, and produce end results in accordance with Contract Documents in effect at the time of the performance of any Work. 4.3 Mowing, and Litter Pickup

The following MRP characteristics feature enhanced performance criteria and associated deductions for failure to perform. All deductions withheld from the contractor will occur through adjustments to the next appropriate monthly invoice amount. For assessing deductions, the annual contract amount will be based on the total amount of the 12 payments preceding the assessment of any deductions. For the first year of the contract, the annual contract amount will be based on the total payments to date.

Roadside Mowing

Maintain an individual characteristic rating of 80 or better as evaluated by the scheduled MRP cycles for Roadside Mowing. If the Contractor fails to achieve the required MRP score of 80 for any MRP cycle, the Department will deduct one eighth of a percent (0.125%) of the annual contract amount for each MRP point below established performance criteria in this section.

Slope Mowing

Maintain an individual characteristic rating of 80 or better as evaluated by the scheduled MRP cycles for Slope Mowing. If the Contractor fails to achieve the required MRP score of 80 for any cycle, the Department will deduct one eighth of a percent (0.125%) of the annual contract amount for each MRP point below established performance criteria in this section.

<u>Litter</u>

Maintain an individual characteristic rating of 80 or better as evaluated by the scheduled MRP cycles for Litter Removal. If the Contractor fails to achieve the required MRP score of 80 for any MRP cycle, the Department will deduct one eighth of a percent (0.125%) of the annual contract amount for each MRP point below established performance criteria in this section.

Reflective Pavement Markers

Maintain an individual characteristic rating of 80 or better as evaluated by the scheduled MRP cycles for Reflective Pavement Markers. If the Contractor fails to achieve the required MRP score of 80 for any MRP cycle, the Department will deduct one eighth of a percent (0.125%) of the annual contract amount for each MRP point below established performance criteria in this section.

Striping

Maintain an individual characteristic rating of 80 or better as evaluated by the scheduled MRP cycles for Striping. If the Contractor fails to achieve the required MRP score of 80 for any MRP
