1. Who will be responsible for FPL fees?	1. The Contractor.
2. Who will be responsible for State Fire Marshall permit and plan processing fees?	The Contractor will be responsible for all fees associated with this type of tasks. Reference to Exhibit 'A" – Scope of Work, Section 3.
Who will be responsible for City of Sweetwater permit and plan processing fees?	3. The Contractor will be responsible for all fees associated with this type of tasks. Reference to Exhibit 'A" – Scope of Work, Section 3.
4. Given the case a rented temporary generator is needed, who will be responsible for the rental and refueling?	Refer to Attachment 1 to Exhibit A, Drawing E-6 titled "General Notes and Specifications", Note #2.
5. Lately cities have been requesting elevation certificates upon completion. If a certificate is required, who will be paying for it?	5. Elevation Certificate, when needed, will be paid by the Department.

6. FPL does not allow splices inside the CT cabinet. Plans call for reusing those wires, but I do not believe they reach from the CT to the ATS. Given the case the wires do not reach who will be responsible for the cost to replace the wires from the new ATS to the FPL transformer?

6. Refer to Attachment 1 to Exhibit A, Drawing E-3 titled "Electrical Riser Diagram", which shows a 14"x14"x36" Wiring Gutter between the CT and the New ATS. If splices are not allowed in the CT enclosure, then the Contractor shall provide a new 800Amp CT enclosure. Shown below is a typical picture.
