Call to Order

Chair Stevens called the meeting to order. Executive Director David Darm called the roll. A quorum was present.

Pledge of Allegiance

Chair Stevens led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Welcome and Introductions

Chair Stevens invited the Commissioners and Advisors to introduce themselves. He informed participants that the meeting was being recorded and all feedback received, including comments within the webinar chat box, will be reflected in the meeting minutes.

Public Comments

No public comments were received.

Presentation by the Central Florida Regional Transportation Authority (LYNX)

Norm Hickling, Director of Mobility Services with LYNX, presented a few highlights as far as opportunities and challenges. He reported that the Pre-Covid trip demand was currently at 80%. The first seven months of this year, 300,000 trips were provided, stating that TD and ADA trips were 6% higher than the same time last year. Employment and medical centers are opening back up and everyone is getting comfortable with participating in the services again. Medical and dialysis services continue to be the number one trip demand request.

One of the challenges presented is a request for a new service provider, in a few short months a decision will be made on who the new service provider will be. Funding impacts continue to be a concern. Norm Hickling asked that the Commissioners look and discuss this issue for the future. No vehicles can be purchased from the State of Florida due to the supply chain issues, getting additional vehicles will be a big help.

Mr. Hickling stated that there are 14 agencies who are under contract, many of them are concerned about how they are going to maintain the vehicles that they have because they are unable to get parts, and they can't get warranty work done quickly. Operator and staff issues continue to make recruiting process tough. New phone systems are being considered to help improve the customers' experience, including text messages going out and returning the customers phone calls. In addition, updating the map systems so it is easier to get around central Florida, and updating the scheduling and reservation system.

Chairman Stevens asked for any comments. No comments were received.

Approval of June 24, 2022, Meeting Minutes

ACTION TAKEN: Commissioner Elwell moved, and Commissioner Knight seconded the motion, to approve the meeting minutes as presented. the motion carried unanimously.

Review and Approval of the FY22-23 Annual Regulatory Plan

General Counsel Rachelle Munson expressed that every year the Commission is required to submit their rule making goals for the next year. This report is the Annual Regulatory Plan. She explained that this is just a guide and there are no specific rules currently.

Ms. Munson stated that the Annual Regulatory Plan is not prohibited nor restricted in any manner if any rule making this Commission develops is made over the next year. This is an action item and will need a formal vote from the Commission.

Chairman Stevens asked for a motion to approve the Annual Regulatory Plan

ACTION TAKEN: Commissioner Knight moved, and Commissioner Barrios seconded the motion, to approve the Regulatory Plan as presented. the motion carried unanimously.

Executive Director Report

David Darm recognized CTD Staff and the University of Florida for their hard work in planning and coordinating the CTD Annual Conference. He shared some highlights from the vision summit that took place in Stuart on May 23, 2022. He said much of the discussion focused on the workforce shortages and impacts of cost of living increases on the system. Stakeholders

expressed that has been hard to compete with other businesses like Amazon, FedEx and UPS, which offering higher wages. This is becoming an industry wide challenge. Stakeholders participating in the Vision Summit highlighted some strategies to help address this problem:

- Bonuses to entice people to stay at the job.
- Outreach efforts and recruiting young people.
- Redefining how people view public transportation as a career path vs. an entry level job.

Some challenges with the recommended strategies are young people failing drug tests, their inability to be flexible, and the challenges of working with difficult customers.

The TD Rate Model and funding challenges were also discussed at the Vision Summit. This included the impacts of the new funding formula within the Trip & Equipment Grant and the challenges with delivering services under the Medicaid program. Mr. Darm suggested that the Commission explore this as workshop discussion in the future.

Other topics discussed during the Vision Summit included the phenomenon of ridership for transit services continues to be low, while the demand for paratransit services is steadily rising. Some agencies are using Micro-Transit as an alternative model to address this challenge. Stakeholders representing planning agencies expressed interest in revisiting some of the requirements of the Planning Grant program and identifying updates that can be made to the manuals. Another big issue is "Quality vs. Equity", which is a challenge across the state. We want to make sure we have a fair approach to the system and have more discussions in the future on this topic.

Mr. Darm also presented a snapshot of the budget. The revenues are projected at \$59.8 million, which represents a slight decrease than what was originally projected. The budget on the expenses side is slightly higher, however some of that is attributed to the Innovative Service Development Grant, which is being supported by the cash within the TD Trust Fund. The budget is monitored every quarter with any updates made as needed.

Chairman Stevens asked for any comments. No comments were received.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Chapter 427, Florida Statutes, tasks the Designated Official Planning Agency (DOPA) with recommending to the Commission a single Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC). Apalachee Regional Planning Council is the DOPA for Leon County. The City of Tallahassee/StarMetro is currently the appointed CTC for Leon County and is providing TD services to the citizens of Leon County.

Pursuant to Chapter 287, Florida Statutes, the City of Tallahassee/StarMetro, as a governmental entity, is able and willing to continue to provide transportation services. As a transit agency, the City of Tallahassee/StarMetro has been able to capitalize on opportunities to develop shuttle services and utilize all resources including their fixed route services in addition to traditional paratransit services to provide cost effective transportation to those who are transportation disadvantaged.

Apalachee Regional Planning Council met on March 24, 2022 and voted to recommend the City of Tallahassee/StarMetro be re-appointed as the Community Transportation Coordinator for Leon County for the period July 1, 2022, through June 30, 2027.

Statement of Issue

Chapter 427.11 Florida Statutes and Rule 41-2 Florida Administrative Code, require that all Florida counties provide transportation services for those considered transportation disadvantaged through physical, mental or economic circumstances. A Community Transportation Coordinator (CTC) in each county administers these services. In January 2002, the City Commission approved StarMetro to be recommended to the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) as the Leon County Community Transportation Coordinator. The approval was based on continued funding of this program to minimize the fiscal and operating impact to the City of Tallahassee. The current Memorandum of Agreement for Leon County with the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged expires on June 30, 2022.

Recommended Action

Option 1: Approve StarMetro to continue as the Community Transportation Coordinator for Leon County, and authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute all agreements as appropriate.

Fiscal Impact

No fiscal impact to the City. Costs associated with the operation of these services are covered by the agencies purchasing transportation, through state funding for transportation services in the rural area and matching funds provided by Leon County.

Supplemental Material/Issue Analysis

History/Facts & Issues

Chapter 427.11 Florida Statutes and Rule 41-2 Florida Administrative Code, require that all Florida counties provide services for the transportation disadvantaged. Florida residents are considered transportation disadvantaged if they are physically, mentally, or economically unable to provide their own transportation. The Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged oversees the disbursement of funds and operation of Transportation Disadvantaged Programs in each county.

Transportation disadvantaged trips in Leon county are funded through various sources including the Commission for Transportation Disadvantaged Trip and Equipment grant, Florida Department of Transportation Section 5311 Rural Transportation grant, and the Agency for Persons with Disabilities. In Leon County, there were 76,718 para-transit trips and 6,528 fixed-route trips made under the coordinated system during the last reporting period (July 2020 - June 2021).

The Memorandum of Agreement with the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged expires on June 30, 2022. A new Community Transportation Coordinator must be selected and in place, at the time the contract expires.

The process for selecting a Community Transportation Coordinator is as follows:

- The Apalachee Regional Planning Council addressed the topic and adopted a resolution at their January 27, 2022, meeting, recommending the City of Tallahassee as the designated Community Transportation Coordinator for Leon County.
- The Transportation Disadvantaged Local Coordinating Board discussed the topic and recommended the City of Tallahassee as the designated Community Transportation Coordinator for Leon County at their February 9, 2022, meeting.
- The Apalachee Regional Planning Council submitted the recommendations to the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged.
- The Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged discussed the recommendations and designated the Community Transportation Coordinator at their February 15, 2022, quarterly business meeting.

Upon final approval, the Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged will enter into a five-year Memorandum of Agreement with StarMetro.

There are numerous benefits to StarMetro continuing as the Community Transportation Coordinator:

- Funding through the Transportation Disadvantaged Program is used to address staffing levels mandated by the ADA guidelines for StarMetro at no cost to the City.
- Increased trips through the coordinated system bus pass programs provide additional federal funding for StarMetro.
- Centralization of all transportation services into one location is better coordination of resources for the citizens of our community.
- Current providers under contract within the service area would continue.

The annualized cost for staffing and operation of the TD program for FY21 is \$628,731. Currently, an average weighted administrative fee of \$6.18 per paratransit trip is being charged for the coordination of the program. Costs associated with the operations of these services are covered by the agencies purchasing transportation, through state funding for transportation services in the rural area and matching funds provided by Leon County.

Department(s) Review

City Attorney's Office, Resource Management, and Grants & Enterprise Resources

Options

1. Approve StarMetro to continue as the Community Transportation Coordinator for Leon County, and authorize the City Manager or his designee to execute all agreements as appropriate.

Pros: Allows the City to take advantage of funding, which provides alternative mobility options for transportation disadvantaged citizens in the City of Tallahassee who otherwise do not qualify for Dial-A-Ride services.

Cons: StarMetro would be responsible for overseeing paratransit transportation services provided to Leon County residents.

2. Do not approve and provide alternative direction to staff.

Pros: None could be identified

Cons: Result in transportation disadvantaged citizens in Leon County being denied transportation.

Leon County Community Transportation Coordinator Recommendation

Dear Mr. Darm,

The Apalachee Regional Planning Council adopted the enclosed resolution recommending that Star Metro, continue serving as the Leon County Community Transportation Disadvantaged Coordinator and be designated by the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged (CTD). This resolution was adopted amid ongoing financial negotiations between the City of Tallahassee (Star Metro) and Leon County governments. The discussions delayed the process and required an extension to the original contract agreement. At this time all negotiations have ended, and Star Metro/City of Tallahassee remains committed to being the CTC for Leon County. This recommendation would have an effective date of January 1, 2023, through June 30, 2027. Minutes of the Council's meeting will be forwarded to you as soon as they are prepared. Star Metro is currently the designated CTC for Leon County. The current contract, with extensions, will expire December 31, 2022.

The Council did not issue a competitive process for the community transportation coordinator for Leon County. As a governmental entity interested in continuing to serve as the CTC, staff assessed the qualifications and determined that Star Metro/City of Tallahassee compiled with the requirements of Chapter 427, Florida Statutes, and Rule 41-2, Florida Administrative Code. The staff recommendation to the ARPC Board was that Star Metro/City of Tallahassee, continues as the Leon County Community Transportation Coordinator. The ARPC Board adopted staff's recommendation by resolution.

The Council respectfully requests that this item be placed on the next CTD meeting agenda, tentatively scheduled in December (date tba) for designation of the Leon County CTC.

BACKGROUND:

Pursuant to s. 427.013(13), F.S., the Commission is required to submit an annual report to the Governor, the President of the Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by January 1 of each year. The report consists of performance data on services delivered by the Coordinated Transportation System from the previous state fiscal year (July 1, 2021 through June 30, 2022).

The DRAFT 2022 Annual Performance Report (APR) is being presented for discussion and approval at the December 15, 2022 Commission Business Meeting. The APR includes two sets of data: 1) a **macro-level, systemwide** overview of the services provided by the Coordinated System in FY 2021-22, captured in the Annual Operating Reports submitted by CTCs; and 2) a **micro-level, programmatic** overview of services funded by the CTD Trip & Equipment (T&E) Grant program in FY 2021-22, captured by the invoice data submitted by CTCs to be reimbursed under the grant.

Due to the time required to compile, review and analyze all data for publication of this report, the DRAFT version does not include all datasets and tables that will be represented in the final version. The Commission contracted with Thomas Howell Ferguson (THF) to assist in conducting the analysis of performance data within this year's APR, with a particular focus on the T&E Grant invoice data.

IX. Legislative Budget Requests for Fiscal Year 2023-24

BACKGROUND:

Each year, the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) submits a Legislative Budget Request (LBR) for the Governor and Legislature to consider as part of the General Appropriations Act for the upcoming fiscal year. The Commission's budget is administratively housed within FDOT and is included as part of the Department's LBR.

For Fiscal Year 2023-24, the Commission is requesting \$10 million in additional budget authority for its grant programs:

- \$4 million in recurring (year-over-year) revenue. This request is supported by
 projected revenues to the Transportation Disadvantaged Trust Fund (TDTF) and (if
 approved) much of the funding would be distributed to all 67 counties through the Trip &
 Equipment Grant funding formula. The intent of this request is to provide support to
 existing TD services and adjust for the rise in costs of providing services under the
 current economic conditions. See Exhibit A
- \$6 million in non-recurring (one fiscal year) revenue to the Innovative Service
 Development (ISD) Grant. This request is supported by unexpended funds within the
 TDTF and represents a \$2 million increase to the \$4 million that was appropriated in
 2022-23. The intent of this request is to support competitive grant projects that test for
 new and innovative services, including greater cross-county mobility options to the TD
 population. See Exhibit B

In addition, the Commission is requesting \$148,704 in additional administrative budget to create a new full-time staff position, which (if approved) would assist the organization in performing data analytics, and to raise the salaries to retain a talented and skilled workforce.


