GRANTS



- July 1 - Earliest start date
- June 30 – Grant End Date – NO EXTENSIONS
- Start date cannot be retroactive
- ALL State Funds
- ALL Require the submission of an Application
- ALL Require a Local Match
(Except REDI Eligible Counties for SC)

GRANTS

Trip and Equipment Grant

- CTCs eligible recipients
- Funded thru \$1.50 vehicle registration and portion of State Transportation Trust Fund
- Funding Allocation based on formula in Rule 41-2.014, FAC
- For Trips and Capital

Shirley Conroy Rural Area Capital Assistance Program Grant

- CTCs eligible recipients
- \$1.4 Million Annually transferred from FDOT
- Competitive Application Process
- For Capital Purchases



GRANTS

Innovation and Service Development Grant

- \$10 million annually per Chapter 338.2278, F.S.
- TD Project Funds to:
 - Increase access to and from job training, employment, health care, and other life-sustaining services;
 - Enhance regional connectivity and cross-county mobility; or,
 - Reduce difficulty connecting TD persons to and from transportation hub to final destination.



GRANTS

Innovation and Service Development Grant (cont.)

- Competitive Application Process
- CTCs and TNCs eligible recipients
- FY2020-21 awarded \$4.4 million/16 projects to date
- 3rd round will be determined at October CTD business meeting
- FY2021-22 application process will begin in the spring
- Start developing project ideas and partnerships now
- Grant writing and technical assistance training coming soon



GRANTS

A FEW REQUIREMENTS

- Must have TD Application on file with eligibility supporting documentation for every rider whose trip is included invoiced to the Commission.
- All project documentation must be retained for five years after the final payment or any audit related finding has been resolved.
- Must comply with State Single Agency Audit Act Requirements.
- Invoices must be sent to FLCTDInvoice@dot.state.fl.us, not Project Manager.



GRANTS

A FEW REQUIREMENTS

- Ensure public records that are exempt or confidential are not disclosed such as TD Rider Eligibility Applications per 119.071(5)(h), Florida Statutes.
- Requires a competitive procurement process for any third party contracts (for purchase of equipment or provision of transportation services).
- Utilize the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's E-Verify system.
- Include required "Payment to Subcontractor" language in all third party contracts.



INVOICES



- Rescue Funding will continue to be available until further notice.
- Should be submitted 30 days after completion of month of services.
- Must be submitted to FLCTDInvoice@dot.state.fl.us, not Project Manager.
- Must utilize CTD invoice workbook.
- Instructions and Workbook can be found at <http://ctd.fdot.gov/granttripequipment.htm>
- Review ALL documentation and Fields before submitting to CTD.
- **ERRORS DELAY EVERYONE'S PAYMENTS!**

INVOICES

COMMON ERRORS

Trip Invoice Tab

- Dates of Service are incorrect
(months with 31 days vs 30 days)
- Incorrect Invoice #
Should be “Grant # + month invoice covers”
Example: Invoice for July Services for Grant #
GOM57 = GOM5707
- Incorrect Grant #
Should be current Grant #
Make sure to use letters for letters and numbers for
numbers “O” “0”



INVOICES

COMMON ERRORS

Trip Summary Data Report Tab

- Trips, miles, passes must match numbers entered on Trip Invoice Tab
- Number of Miles should be rounded and entered as whole numbers
- Report should not include trips, miles or passes that are not on the invoice



INVOICES

COMMON ERRORS

Trip Detail Tabs

(Ambulatory, Wheelchair, etc.)

- Each field must contain correct type of data
ex. “Date” should be a date, not the “Pick Up Time”
- Address must be complete - include number and street name
- All trips must have miles – no “0” mile trips
- High mileage trips are questioned, especially if invoicing by the mile.



INVOICES

COMMON ERRORS

Project Managers conduct a thorough review to identify other potential errors such as:

- Duplicate trips
- Duplicate passes
- Time on vehicle
- Same pickup and destination address

Contact Project Manager to obtain simple formulas to assist your review prior to invoice submission.



REPORTING



- Annual Operating Data
 - Due annually September 15
 - 2nd Year of Redesigned Data Collection System
- Quarterly Operating Report for Local Coordinating Boards
 - CTC should provide an operational report to Planning Agency staff for LCB meeting package.
 - CTC should present report at LCB meeting.
- Vehicle Utilization
 - Provide mileage for TD-funded vehicles to CTD, upon request.

CTC PROCUREMENT



- Nineteen (19) CTC designations (MOA) expire June 30, 2021.
- Planning Agencies should begin their procurement activities soon.
- CTC recommendations will be presented at upcoming Commission meetings.

QUALITY ASSURANCE MONITORING

2019-20 SUGGESTIONS AND FINDINGS

- Lack of eligibility applications and support documentation.
- Weak or inconsistent eligibility criteria in TDSP.
- Missing or incomplete trip manifests.
- Non-TD trips inadvertently included on TD invoices.
- Lack of procedures for completion of annual operating report.
- Lack of supporting documentation for data reported in the annual operating report.



QUALITY ASSURANCE MONITORING

2019-20 SUGGESTIONS AND FINDINGS

- Lack of procedures for completion of rate model worksheets.
- Lack of maintaining support documentation for data utilized in completing rate model worksheets.
- Third-party contracts missing required grant language.
- Lack of documentation reflecting completion of operator & coordination contractor monitoring.
- Missing or incomplete driver records (training, driver license, physical, etc.).
- Lack of E-Verify documentation.



QUALITY ASSURANCE MONITORING

CORRECTIVE ACTION PLANS (CAPS)

- Due within 30 days from date of Final Report.
- Submit on Agency Letterhead.
- Restate Finding, including Finding #.
- Provide explanation of how finding has been or will be corrected.
- Provide actions taken to ensure finding does not repeat.
- Provide timeline if correction has not been implemented yet.



QUALITY ASSURANCE MONITORING

Repeat findings could have negative impact.

- Future CTC designation
- Grant Allocation Reduction or Financial Penalties
- CTC Probation and/or Termination
