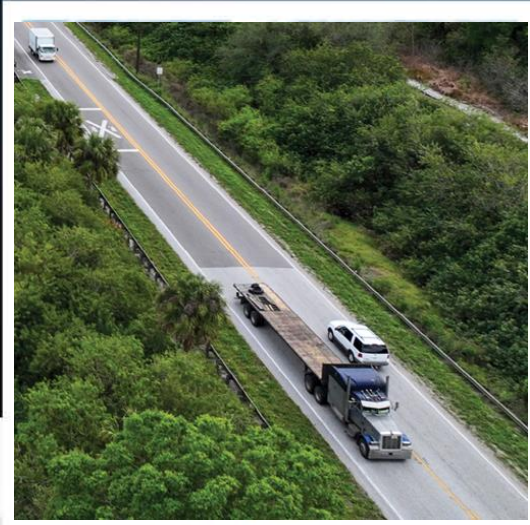

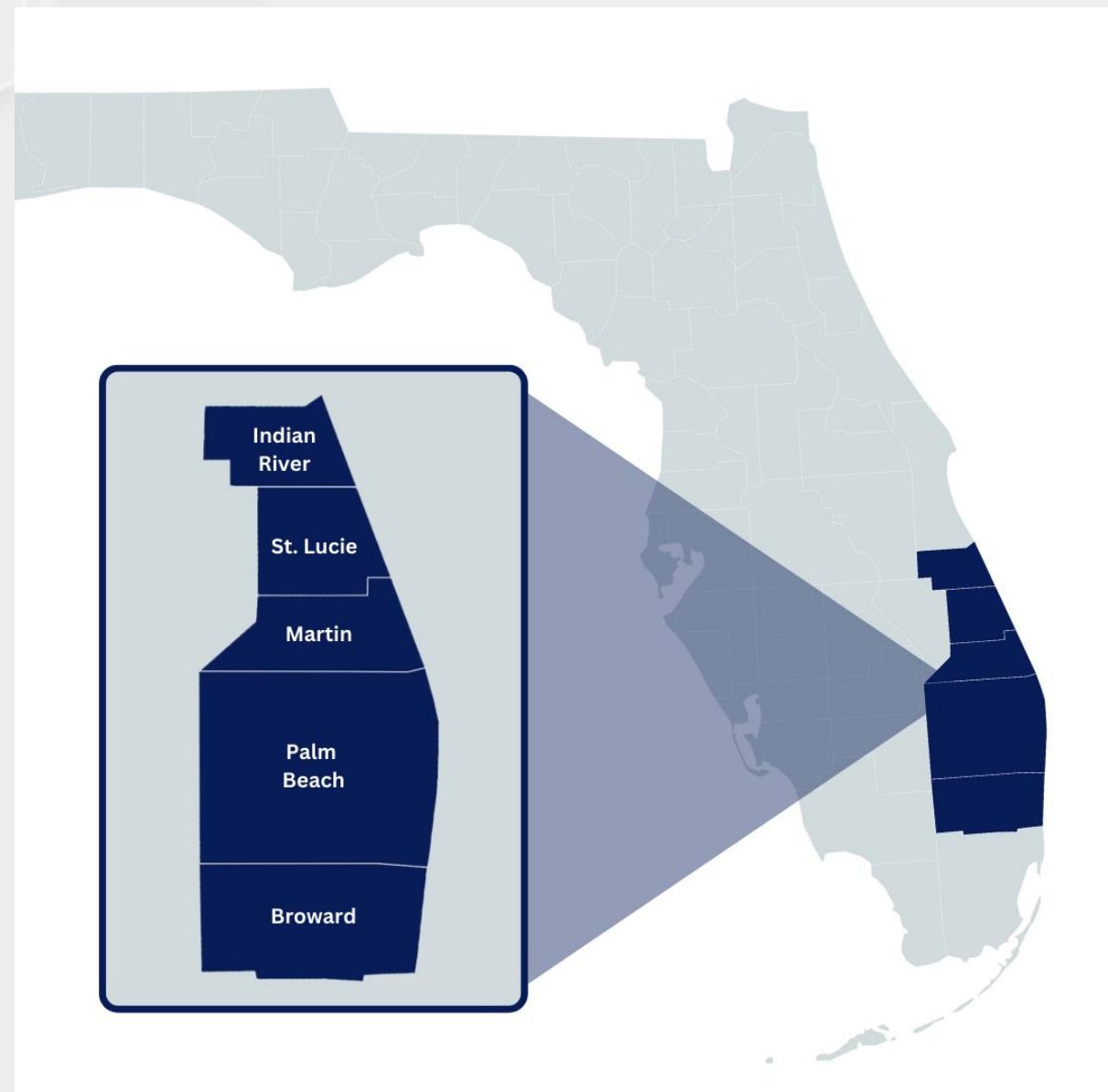

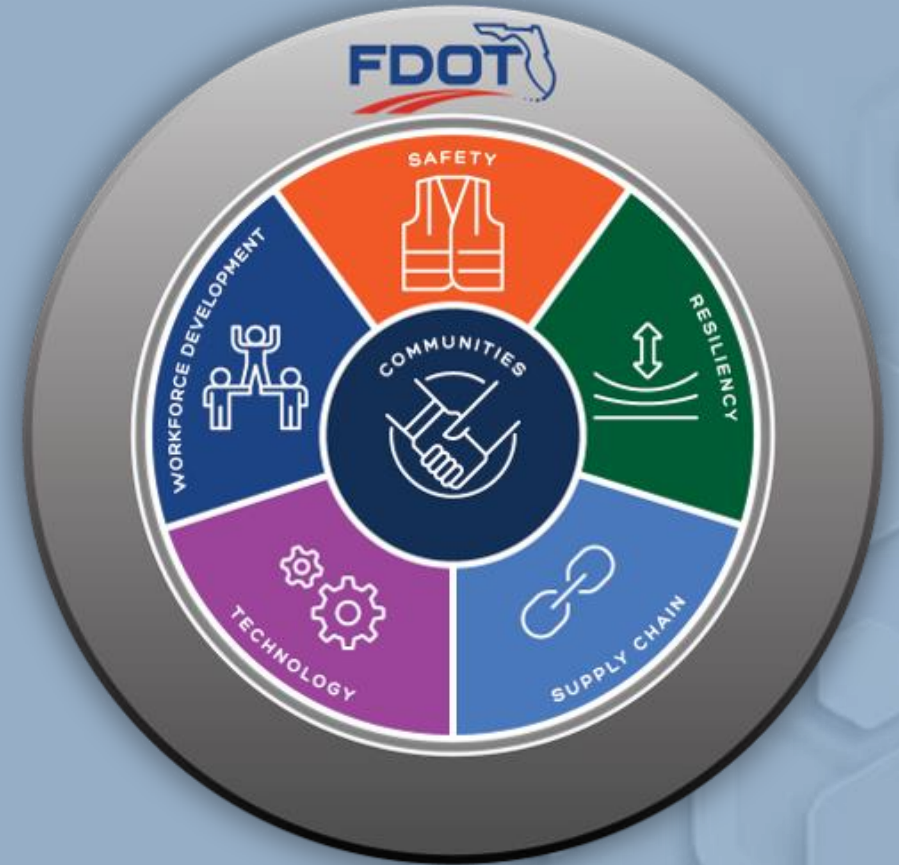


OUR MISSION

General Work Program

FDOT updates construction and right of way costs on an annual basis

Overall, project costs increased with respect to last year

Funding allocations were lower than prior cycle. Changes in revenue projections from most recent Revenue Estimating Conferences impact allocation distribution

Our goal is to maintain projects that were committed in the common four years related to safety, preservation and maintenance

New phases are generally programmed in the "new" 5th year

District 4 Work Program is balanced to the allocations received

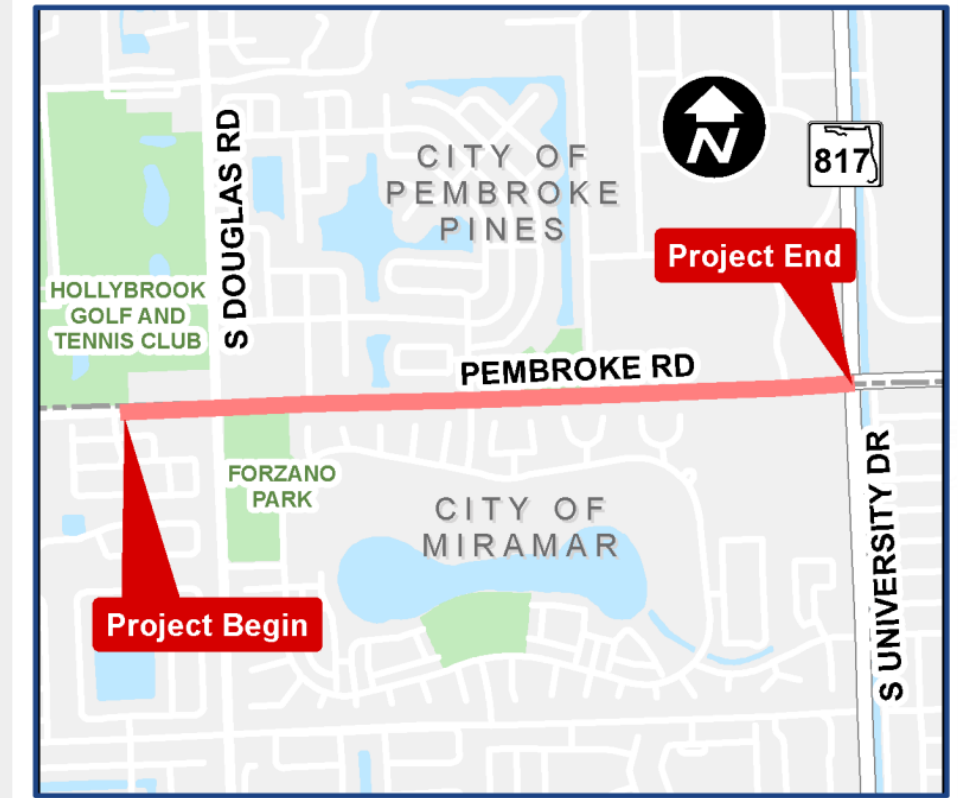

PEMBROKE ROAD FROM DOUGLAS ROAD TO UNIVERSITY DRIVE





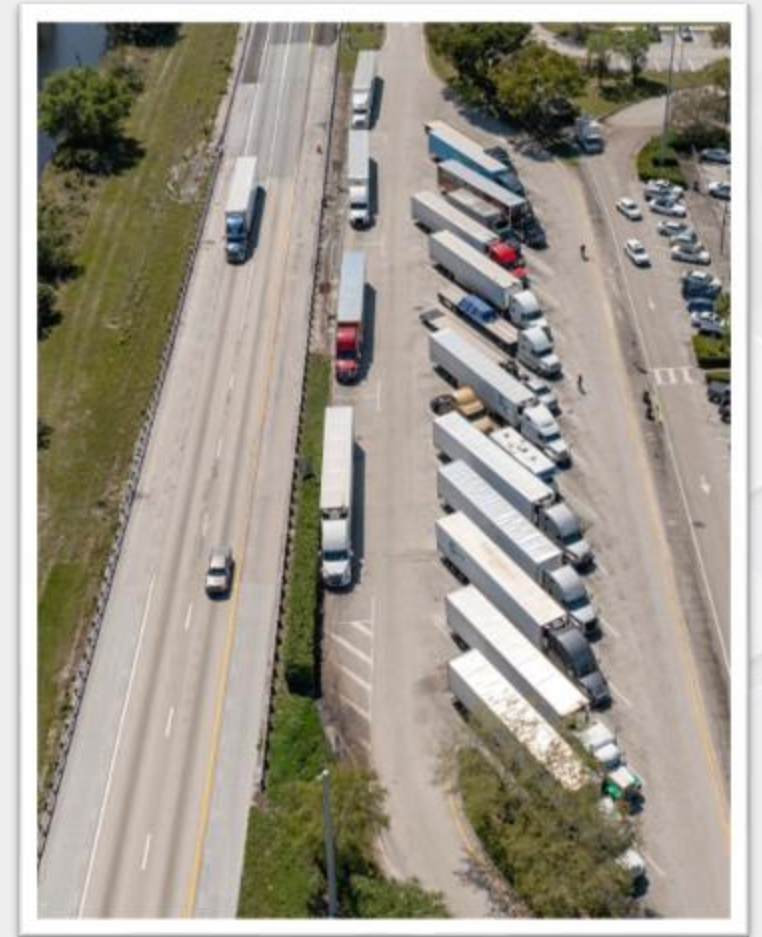
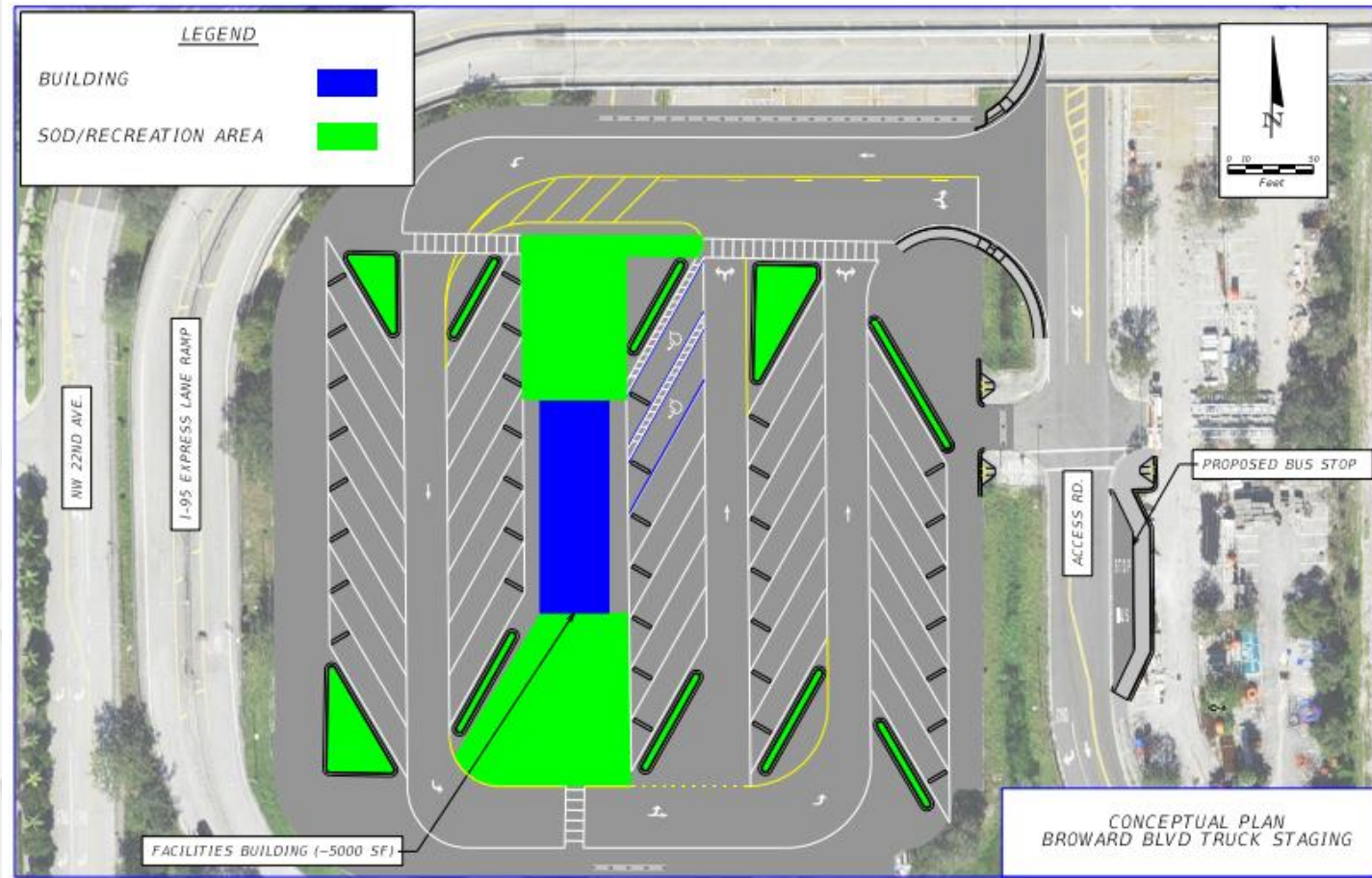

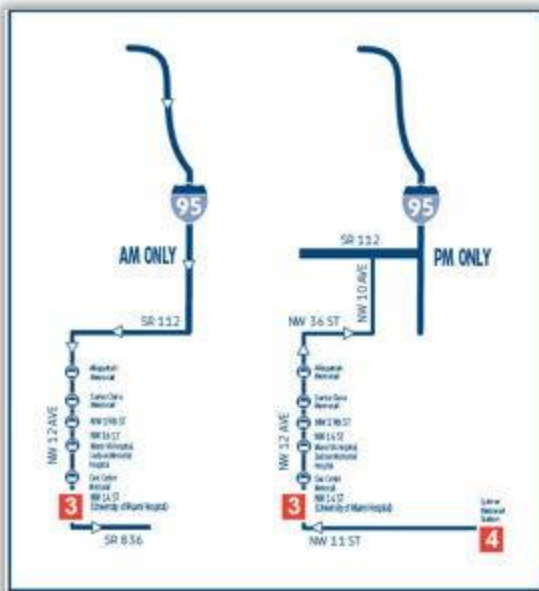




BROWARD BOULEVARD TRUCK PARKING EXPANSION







Broward Express Coach Map



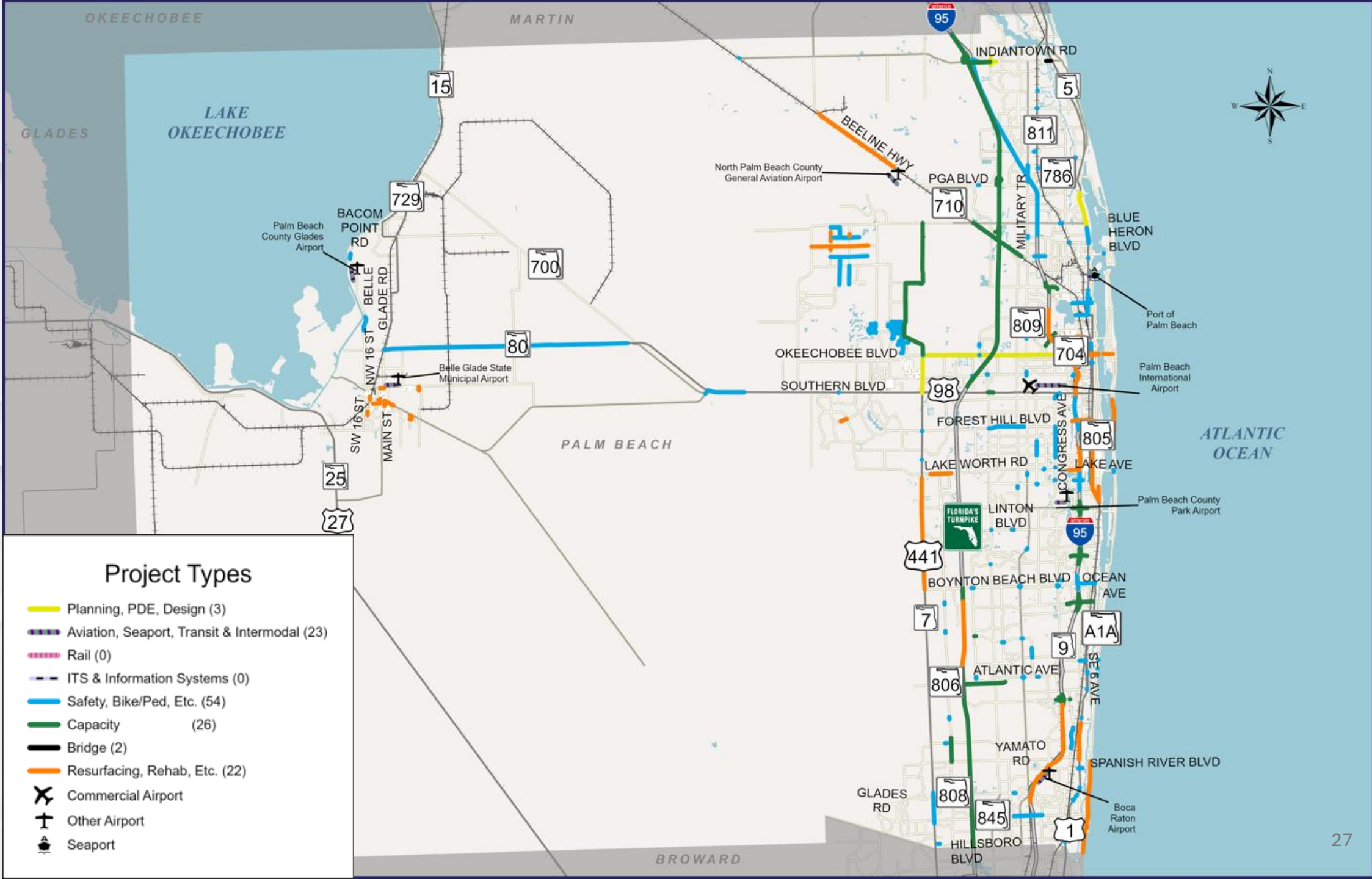

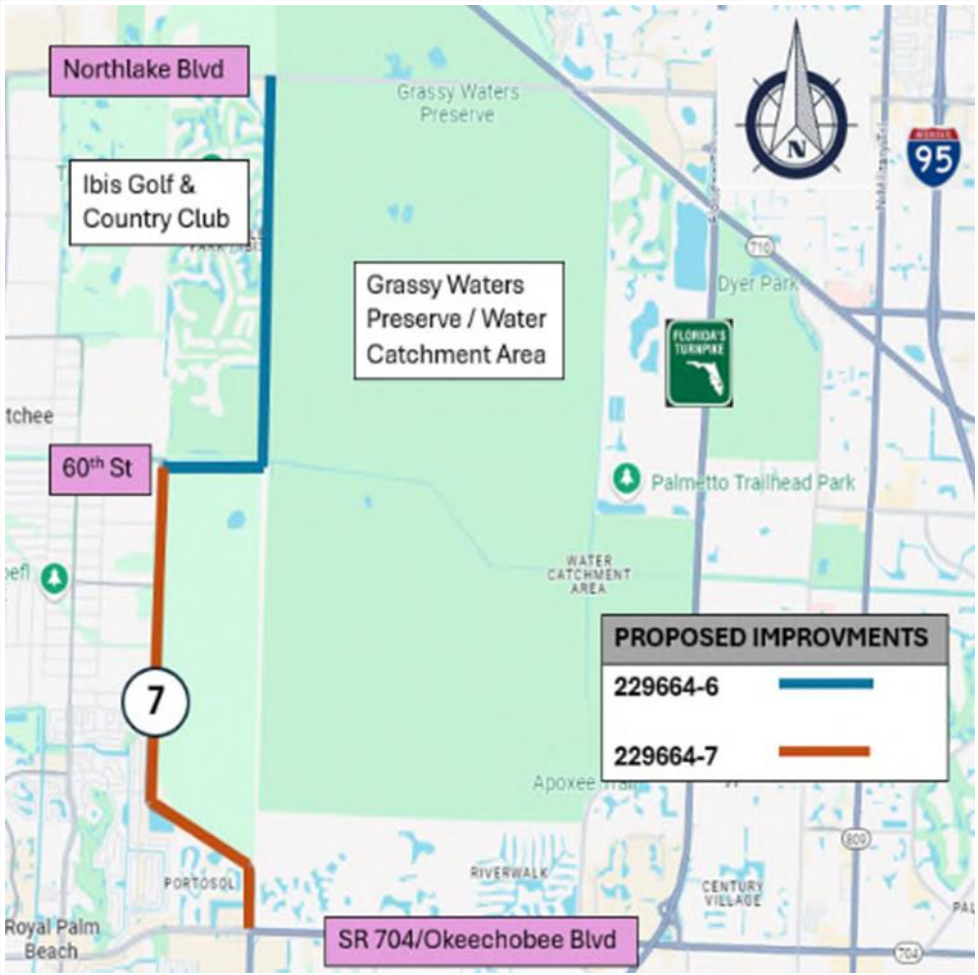

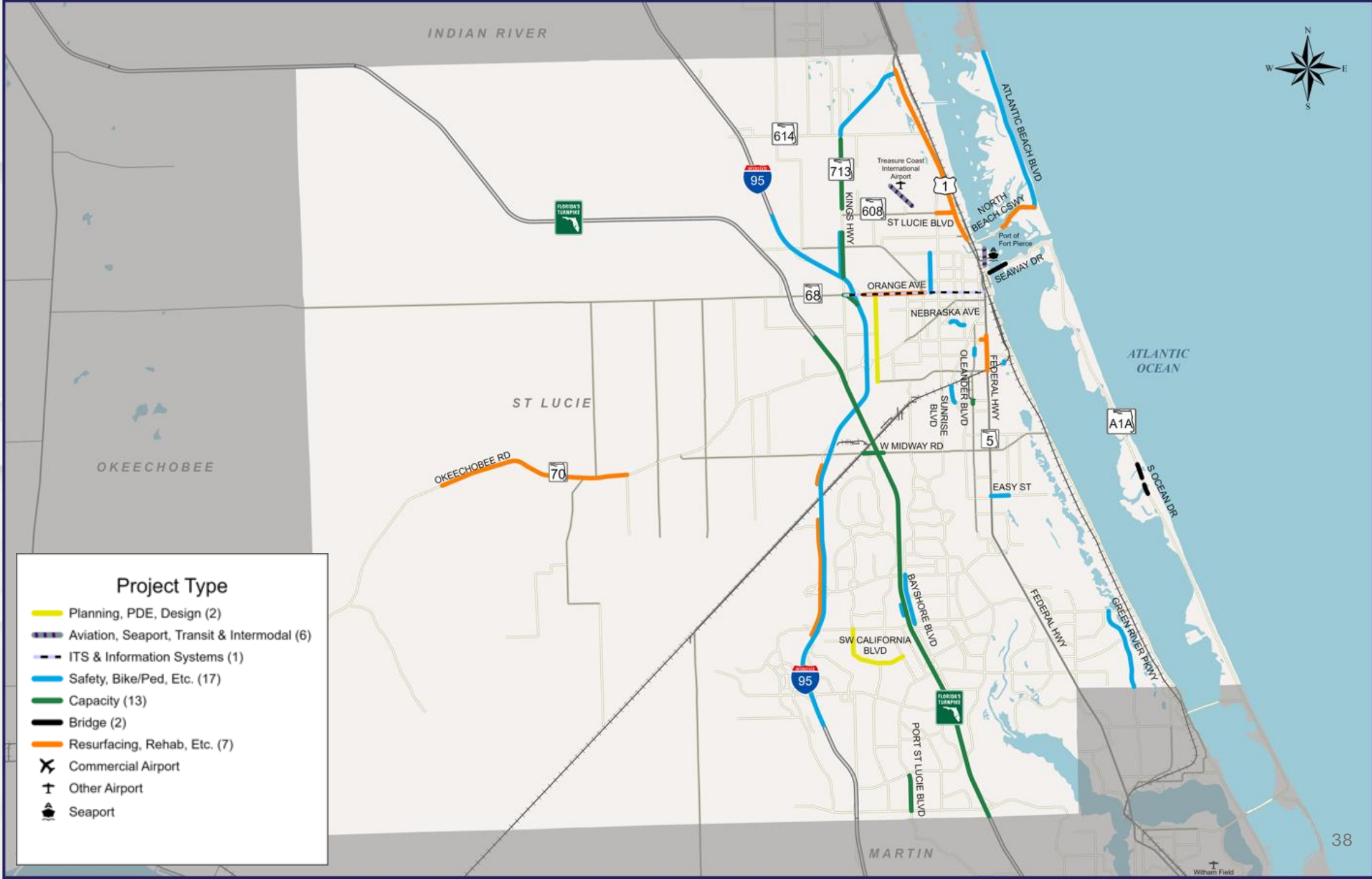
