



FDOT MISSION

To provide a safe transportation system that ensures the mobility of people and goods, enhances economic prosperity and preserves the quality of our environment and communities

FDOT PRIORITIES

- √ Safety
- ✓ Preservation of State Highway System
- ✓ Capacity improvements & other projects
- ✓ Transit, airports, seaports, rail, bicycle & pedestrian programs funded by state & federal transportation funds
- ✓ Coordination with federal and local governments, TPOs, county commissions and municipalities

FDOT DISTRICT SIX







- Includes Miami-Dade & Monroe counties – more than 2.8 million residents
- District Six's state road system
 - o 700 centerline miles
 - 2,835 lane miles
- Served by
 - o 629 bridges
 - 44 aviation facilities
 - 78 private airports
 - o 2 rail lines
 - 2 deep-water ports
 - 2 rail fixed guideway systems
- More than 34 million vehicle miles daily

After the appropriations are approved by the Legislature, the Work






FDOT District Six Total Work Program Chart FY 2023 - 2027



Total 5-Year Tentative Work Program \$3.4B




FDOT District Six Work Program Product Chart FY 2023 - 2027



Total 5-Year Tentative Work Program - Product \$1.99B




FDOT District Six Work Program Construction Chart FY 2023 - 2027




I-395 Design-Build
