Successful Consultant Practices

- Constant conversation between the Department and Consultant PM's – weekly update meetings
- 2. Sufficiency review meeting for public meeting deliverables
- 3. Iterative process for alternative development (traffic workshop)
- 4. Develop consistency in public involvement messaging & presentation
- 5. Accommodate stakeholders' needs and vision



Turnpike

- Quality assurance & quality control on submittals
- Being proactive in project management and coordination with the Department
- Continuously meet the permitting milestones & submittals
- Realistic staff hour estimates reflecting the scope not project budget



Successful Consultant Practices

- 1. Quality documents and collaterals
- 2. Adherence to schedule
- 3. Innovative engagement grass roots
- 4. Innovative and effective design concepts
- Recognizing and mitigating risks during the PD&E Phase



- Proactively schedule species specific surveys
- Quality, quality, quality
- Proactive problem solving
- Plan communications from the stakeholder's and partner's perspective
- Meet people where they are (see examples of non-FDOT meetings)

Successful Consultant Practices

- Permitting and PD&E Firms are very responsive to requests for additional information (RAIs) and provide quality communication to Project Managers.
- Public Involvement Firms are providing robust support for activities in PD&E.
 Renderings for construction processes, final concepts and virtual/in-person support.
- 3. Districtwide Contracts Environmental services reliable, great communication and QA/QC is consistent with minimal revisions.
- 4. Consultant Environmental SMEs/Subs Direct Communication Discussion between the DOT environmental specialist and the consultant's specialist staff or subcontractor producing the documentation results in less revisions, confusion and consistency in messaging instead of PM acting as a gatekeeper.



- Environmental Permitting Permit packages need to include consultation w/ resource agencies (FWS, SHPO, etc.) previously conducted. Mostly firms that didn't do the PD&E work. Need to do a better job checking with FDOT staff to make sure this documentation is included.
- Project Concept Development Not fully vetted for concept design before draft environmental documents (NRE specifically) are submitted. Development of the alternative(s) needs to be further along.
- QA/QC Editorial mistakes are common, latest versions of guidance documents and checklists are not followed. Common theme/response is "that is how D1,3,4, etc. does it" in response to comments.
 Consultants need to be aware of differences between districts (geographically, socially and environmentally).
 More emphasis on doing a more thorough job before submission to the District. During comment/review periods, it is more productive for consultants to keep communication going, to ask for clarification or more direct guidance language, than to edit and review the same document multiple times.

- Problem Solving- Consistent collaboration with PD&E team and Department on resolving problems







Successful Consultant Practices

- Teaming and presenting staff resources
- Response times
- Quality of visuals
- Quality of engineering analysis
- Direct communication with FDOT support staff
- Using QA/QC checklists (internal and Department provided)
- Having monthly project meetings with FDOT staff

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- Follow through on ideas/approach to project and schedule presented during selection
- Schedule discovery meeting with FDOT PM and support staff within first 2 weeks
- As soon as NTP is received schedule public kick-off meeting and develop project website
- When scheduling public meetings work backwards from target date to meet required mailout dates, internal review and MPO agenda deadlines



- More "plain English" approach to presentations
- Be more proactive in response to community concerns
- Keep FDOT staff informed on staffing changes
- Work on documents and SWEPT uploads as work progresses instead of waiting for critical milestones
- QA/QC process

- 2. A focus on a concept and engineering solutions that can be readily be implemented in design
- 3. In depth knowledge and experience (PD&E, NEPA, etc.)
- 4. Partnering with communities, community input consideration
- 5. Start with the end in mind and being flexible in how we get there







- Availability of Staff

- QA/QC



Successful Consultant Practices

- Coordination with municipalities and with the public through numerous public meetings, HOA meetings, Project Advisory Team Committees
- 2. One on one meetings as requested
- 3. Coordination with other on-going projects in the area, crossing district boundaries
- 4. Navigating through controversy with manage lanes via education
- 5. Incorporation of VE recommendations

Requests for Improvement

- Better planning studies to minimize alternatives during PD&E
- Checking with design team (alignments and criteria verification needs to be check) ahead of getting too advanced in the design such as variations and exceptions
- Segmenting solutions into more manageable size design / construction projects
- Balancing right of way acquisition with meeting criteria

- 2. Submit monthly invoices within 30-45 days.
- 3. Anticipates challenges/problems and provides solutions.
- 4. Understand the unique needs/challenges and provide customized solutions.



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Requests for Improvement

- 1. Provide qualified Quality Control reviewers for both technical and presentation/grammar.
- 2. Don't be afraid to consult/discuss during comment resolution.
- 3. Make sure templates are up-to-date.
- 4. Be aware of District preferences.






