See Florida's second oldest lighthouse constructed in 1831.



Stand in the footsteps of Hernando DeSoto at his winter encampment site.
- D [Florida Governor's Mansion](#)
First constructed in 1907, this historic home has housed 25 Florida's Governors.
- E [Florida's Historic Capitol](#)
Built in 1845, the Historic Capitol building is now a museum honoring Florida's past.
- F [Goodwood Museum & Gardens](#)
This historic plantation turned luxury home displays history from different perspectives.
