


Pierson Municipal Airport (2J8) is a small turf runway general aviation (GA) airport situated in the town of Pierson, approximately 17 miles north of DeLand and 25 miles west of Daytona Beach.

The airport has a 2,600-foot-long by 200-feet-wide turf runway (Runway 5-23). Originally established in 1943 to support Pierson's agriculture industry, the airport now primarily accommodates local flight training activities. This includes training operations from Embry Riddle Aeronautical University based at the Daytona Beach International Airport (DAB).

Additionally, law enforcement agencies utilize the airport for aerial surveillance and flight training operations. The airport is also popular for recreational flyers who often visit nearby restaurants and Lake George, located less than five miles west of 2J8.

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:
