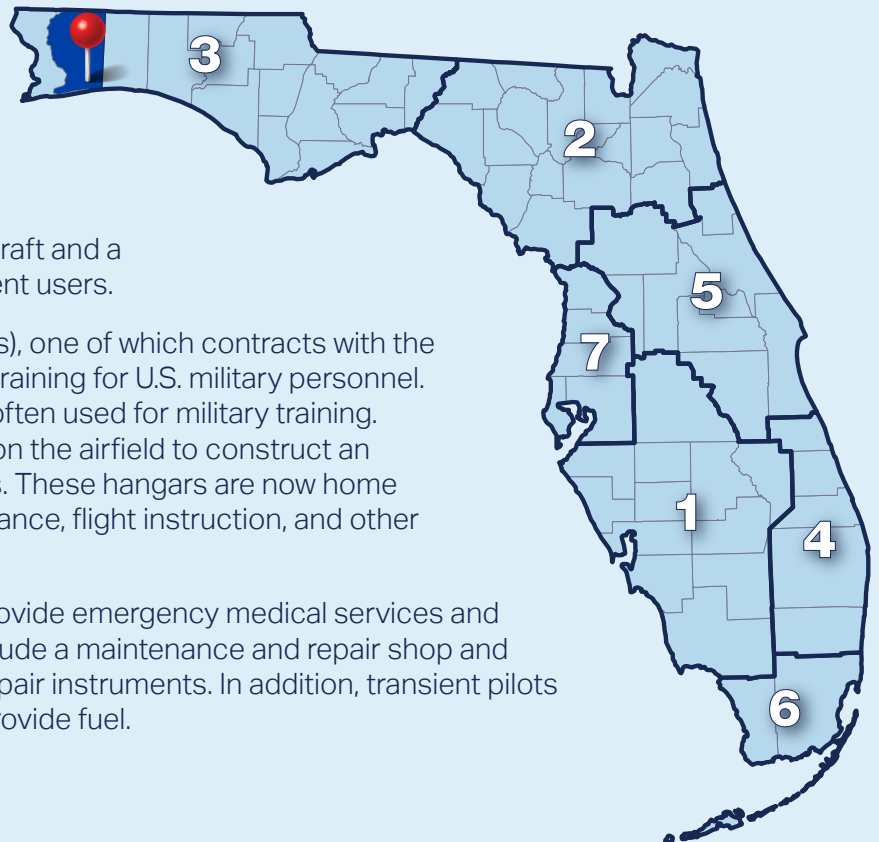

Peter Prince Field (2R4) is in Santa Rosa County, approximately 20 miles northeast of downtown Pensacola along Florida's Gulf Coast. The airport has one runway measuring 3,701 feet long by 75 feet wide (Runway 18-36). The airport accommodates small general aviation (GA) aircraft and a variety of aviation activities for local and transient users.

The airport has two fixed-base operators (FBOs), one of which contracts with the U.S. Navy to conduct ground school and flight training for U.S. military personnel. Because of this joint agreement, the airport is often used for military training. The other FBO developed a large tract of land on the airfield to construct an administrative office, office space, and hangars. These hangars are now home to several tenants that provide aircraft maintenance, flight instruction, and other services.

MedTrans bases air ambulances at 2R4 that provide emergency medical services and transports. Other businesses at the airport include a maintenance and repair shop and an avionics shop that is available to install or repair instruments. In addition, transient pilots frequently refuel at the airport, as both FBOs provide fuel.

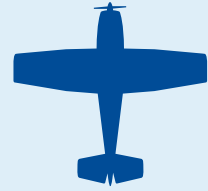

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
