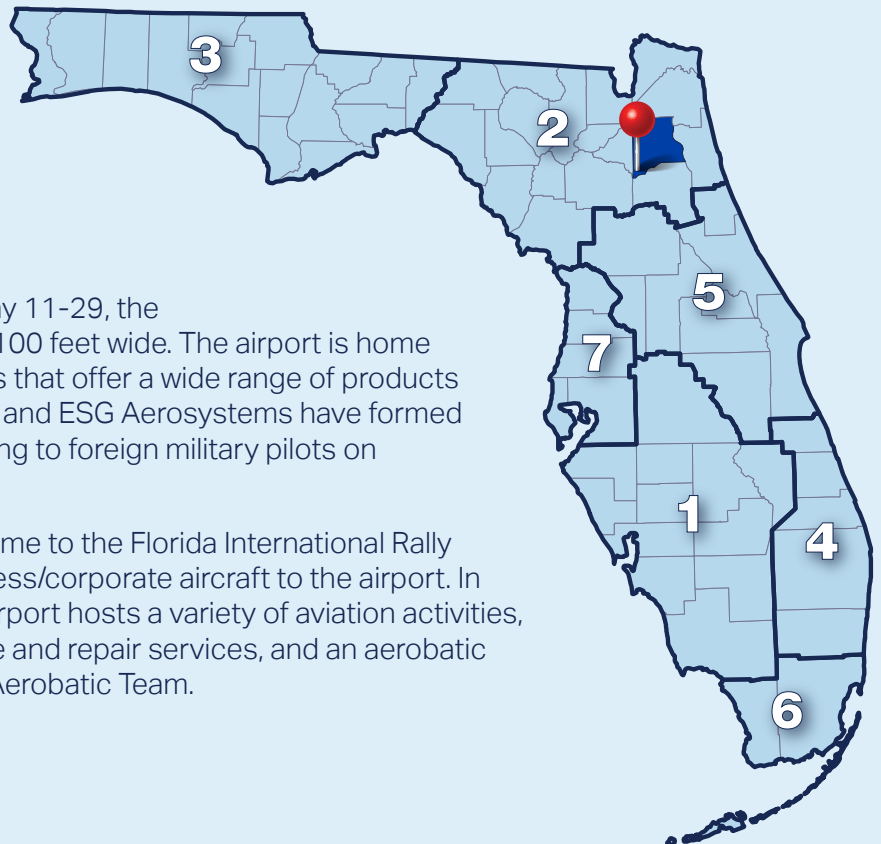

Keystone Heights Airport (42J) is a publicly owned, public-use airport in northeast Florida, located three miles north of the City of Keystone Heights. The airport is owned by the Keystone Heights Airport Authority and serves general aviation activities.

42J has two runways, Runway 5-23 and Runway 11-29, the longest of which measures 5,046 feet long by 100 feet wide. The airport is home to several aviation and non-aviation businesses that offer a wide range of products and services. Notably, MHD Rockland Services and ESG Aerosystems have formed a partnership to provide specialized flight training to foreign military pilots on Lockheed P-3 Orion aircraft.

42J also hosts multiple flight schools and is home to the Florida International Rally & Motorsport Park (FIRM), which attracts business/corporate aircraft to the airport. In addition to the onsite businesses at 42J, the airport hosts a variety of aviation activities, including recreation flying, aircraft maintenance and repair services, and an aerobatic box which is used to train members of the US Aerobatic Team.

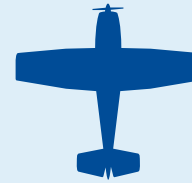

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
