


Merritt Island Airport (COI) is a general aviation (GA) airport situated along Sykes Creek on Merritt Island, near Cocoa Beach and the famed Space Coast. The airport has one paved runway (11-29) measuring 3,601 feet long by 75 feet wide to accommodate small GA aircraft.

COI mainly experiences flight training activities generated by 2FLY Airborne and several other tenants. Space Coast Aviation is a full-service fixed-base operator (FBO), offering fuel sales, aircraft rentals, aircraft storage, charter services and pilot training.

The airport is also popular with recreational visitors who typically fly in for the weekend to visit several attractions in the area, including the Kennedy Space Center and Cocoa Beach. Other aviation activities at COI include biplane tours and aerial banner towering services that operate out of the airport to fly over Cape Canaveral's popular beaches.

The airport is also home to an active local chapter of the Experimental Aircraft Association (EAA) that offers flights to local students through the Young Eagles program.

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
