




Key West International Airport (EYW) is in Monroe County just east of downtown Key West. The airport offers one paved runway (9-27) that is 5,076 feet long by 100 feet wide. Located on the island's southern shore, the airport is vital to serving the community of Key West, which is one of Florida's top tourist destinations.

Six commercial airlines provide nonstop service from over 20 domestic destinations. In addition to scheduled commercial service, the airport supports general aviation (GA). Recreational flying activities such as biplane rides, sightseeing tours, and helicopter tours are available for travelers seeking to experience Key West from a new perspective.

EYW is also a designated Port of Entry with U.S. Customs and Border Protection for processing international arrivals.

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
