Located in southwest Jacksonville, Herlong Recreational Airport (HEG) provides a convenient and attractive option for recreational pilots flying in the region. The smallest of the four airports operated by the JAA, HEG fulfills an important role in the local aviation landscape.


HEG caters to recreational flying, which composes nearly 90 percent of activities occurring at the airport. Notably, HEG is the only facility in Jacksonville with based glider and skydiving operations.

The airport also supports business/corporate aviation, flight training, police/law enforcement activities, and emergency air medical transportation. These activities are accommodated by HEG's two paved runways, the longest of which measures 4,001 feet long by 100 feet wide (Runway 7-25).

HEG prides itself on engaging with the local community. Local students can display their artwork at the airport, and featured artists are invited on an airport tour to view their work. In addition, HEG offers tours to other community organizations, including youth groups and homeschooled students.
