Inverness Airport (INF) is a general aviation (GA) airport located in Citrus County, approximately 60 miles northeast of downtown Tampa.


The airport is publicly owned by Citrus

County, with day-to-day management provided by Right Rudder Aviation, the airport's fixed-base operator (FBO). INF has one runway (Runway 1-19) that measures 5,000 feet long by

75 feet wide.

Inverness Airport primarily supports recreational flying, business aviation, and flight training. The FBO is partnered with Mesa Airlines, who provides flight training (specifically to help commercial pilots get their 1500 hours). Additionally, the Citrus County Sheriff's Office Aviation Unit and a medivac tenant conduct a significant number of helicopter operations at the airport.

INF is an avid supporter of the community through its ongoing partnerships with various non-profit organizations and hosts events that provide opportunities for all members of the community to experience aviation.

#### Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
