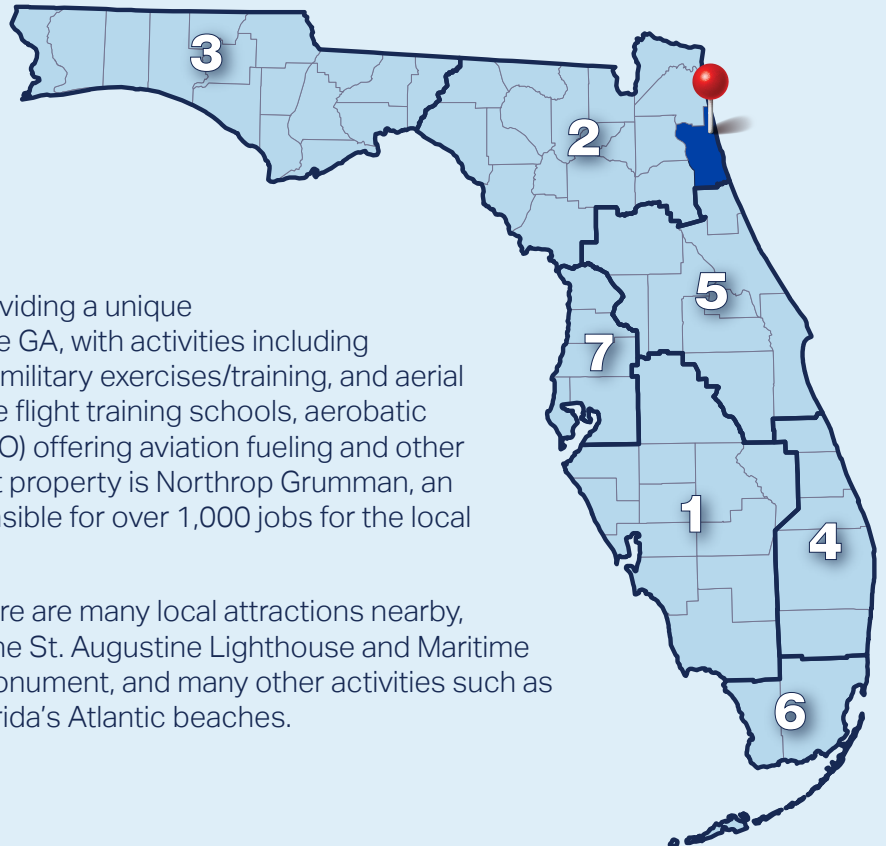

Northeast Florida Regional Airport (SGJ) is a general aviation (GA) airport located approximately four miles north of St. Augustine, known as the oldest city in America. The airport offers three paved runways, the longest of which is 8,001 feet long by 150 feet wide (13-31).

The airport also has several water runways, providing a unique landing environment. The operations at SGJ are GA, with activities including corporate and business travel, public charters, military exercises/training, and aerial business operations. These businesses include flight training schools, aerobatic training services, and a fixed base operator (FBO) offering aviation fueling and other services. A notable business located on airport property is Northrop Grumman, an aerospace defense contractor, which is responsible for over 1,000 jobs for the local community.

For those pilots and visitors flying into SGJ, there are many local attractions nearby, including Ponce de Leon's Fountain of Youth, the St. Augustine Lighthouse and Maritime Museum, el Castillo de San Marcos National Monument, and many other activities such as fishing, golfing, camping, or just relaxing on Florida's Atlantic beaches.

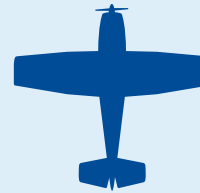

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

Per Florida statute, the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP) is periodically updated to summarize the airport and aviation needs in Florida while remaining consistent with the goals of the Florida Transportation Plan (FTP). The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
