






Tallahassee International Airport (TLH) is a Primary Non-Hub airport in the City of Tallahassee. TLH has two runways, the longest of which measures 8,000 feet long by 150 feet wide (Runway 9-27).

TLH has uncongested airspace which facilitates operations for air carriers. Serving the state capital, TLH supports a full range of commercial, military, and GA activities. GA aircraft, pilots, and their passengers are supported by two full-service fixed-based operators (FBOs) at TLH. Multiple specialized aviation service operators are also located at the airport. Other tenants offering passenger support services include rental car companies, concessionaires, and restaurants.

Commercial passenger service is provide by American Airlines, Delta Air Lines, Silver Airways, and JetBlue Airways, with nonstop service to 8 domestic destinations. The airport provides important connectivity for the many academic institutions in the area, including Florida State University (FSU), Florida Agricultural and Mechanical University (FAMU), Tallahassee Community College (TCC), and Lively Technical College (LTC). Students, faculty, and visitors use TLH to travel for university-related athletic, business, research, and other purposes.

Overview of the FASP 2043 Update:

The FASP 2043 Update focuses on reviewing the applicability of the various goals, objectives, and performance measures to support two primary goals: 1) provide for more efficiency in decision making within FDOT to support funding and development decisions, and 2) provide airports within the system with recommendations for development that support their individual missions while contributing to the overall strength and health of the Florida airport system.
