

Hello, I am John Tyler, FDOT District Five Secretary. Welcome to the tentative five-year work program public hearing. District Five covers the Central Florida region which includes: Brevard, Flagler, Lake, Marion, Orange, Osceola, Seminole, Sumter, and Volusia Counties.

Here at the Florida Department of Transportation, our goal is to provide a transportation system that enhances safety and preserves our network for future generations. The Five-Year Work Program is our plan for transportation system improvements over the next five years. The work program identifies project needs in our region and details their construction and funding schedules. Here is more information about this year's work program and how to get involved.

Developing the work program each year involves extensive coordination with our local and state government partners, including the metropolitan planning organizations, or MPO's. In collaboration with our partners, the Department has established the work program which identifies a wide variety of transportation projects, such as safety improvements, operational enhancements, connectivity, capacity upgrades, bridge improvements, maintenance projects, and travel options. Throughout the plan you will also find projects related to transit, aviation, rail, space, and the seaport.

At the Work Program website, you will find an interactive map to review each proposed project by County. Each of the projects listed will include the proposed project's location, details of the improvements, and a summary of the funding plan.

This year, the work program public hearing will take place online beginning on Monday, October 20, 2025, through Friday, October 24, 2025. The Department will also host an in-person open house on October 21, 2025, from 3 PM – 5:30 PM at the District Office, located at 719 South Woodland Boulevard, DeLand, Florida 32720.

Your input is important in this process and will help us shape and improve the transportation landscape in our region. Comments about the five-year work program can be submitted online using the comments section of the project website, or in-person by filling out a comment form during the open house.
