What is a PD&E Study?







- Required to satisfy the National Environmental Policy Act and associated federal and state laws and regulations
- Formal FDOT process to ensure that consideration is given to environmental impacts, social impacts, public input, engineering design and project costs
- Involves engineering analysis and environmental evaluation, all accomplished within the context of a public participation plan
- Includes data collection, traffic forecasts, alternatives development, engineering analyses, environmental analyses and documentation
- Involves the preparation of preliminary engineering and environmental documentation
- Continuous public engagement and coordination with Federal, State, and Local Agencies



- I-95: 65 mph
 - √ 8 general use lanes (four in each) direction)
 - ✓ Between two to four Managed lanes
- 6.6 Miles
- 6 existing interchanges
 - ✓ Only the 3 interchanges in the northern part of the study area (Sheridan Street, Stirling Road, and Griffin Road at I-95) are proposed for improvements in this study.




Study Area

Project Goals and Objectives





- ✓ Potential Interchange improvements at Sheridan Street, Stirling Road, Griffin Road
- Mainline/collector-distributor (CD) facilities from north of Hollywood Boulevard to north of Griffin Road
- Express lane access points elevated braided ramps over the SR 9/I-95 corridor mainline from Ives Dairy Road to north of Griffin Road
- Address wrong-way crashes at Old Griffin Road
- Evaluate the social, economic, physical and environmental impacts associated with the potential improvements
- Maintain consistency with the current I-95 Express Lanes,
 Master Plans, adjacent projects, and local projects
- Satisfy the Study's Purpose and Need
- ✓ Obtain approval to implement improvements







The purpose of the study is to:

- ✓ Improve mainline operations and improve traffic operations at the existing interchanges, cross streets, and managed lanes now and in the future
- ✓ Enhance safety along SR 9/I-95 from Miami-Dade/Broward County Line to north of Griffin Road in Broward County, Florida
- ✓ Address <u>social demands</u>, <u>economic development</u>, <u>and other modes</u> of travel (all roadway users)
- ✓ Address <u>local concerns and area needs</u> on adjacent major arterials (roadways) including Old Griffin Road
- ✓ Implement short-term and long-term solutions to enhance multimodal connectivity to major employment centers and residential areas
- Provide opportunities to program and fund smaller projects within overall study limits through "Project Segmentation"



Needs of Project – Traffic





Existing Traffic:

- Population and employment growth are contributing to an increase in traffic volumes.
- 2021 Annual Average Daily Traffic (AADT) between 198,500 and 256,000 vehicles
 - ✓ Over-congested interchanges, ramp terminals, and cross streets
 - ✓ Sheridan Street, Stirling Road, and Griffin Road: eastbound recurring congestion
 - ✓ Off-ramp queue spills over to the mainline








Needs of Project – Traffic





Future Traffic

- Traffic demand projected to continue increasing at 0.5% per year.
- Projected 2050 AADT estimated between 248,000 and 333,400 vehicles.
- Level of Service (LOS) is failing at Griffin Road, Stirling and Sheridan Street Intersections







4,764 crashes between 2016 and 2020

- ✓ Approximately 24 fatal and 1834 injuries
- Predominant crash type are rear-end crashes (2496 crashes)
- Higher rear end crashes may be related to congestion
- Wet crashes exceed statewide average for the mainline, ramps and side streets

High Crash Spots (2013- 2019)



Social Demands and Economic Development

- ✓ Connects major employment and population centers
- ✓ Supports freight and goods movement
 - ✓ Ports, airports, seaports
 - ✓ Supply chain and logistics

Growth

- ✓ According to the Broward MPO LRTP, Broward County's population is expected to grow 27% between 2015 and 2045
- ✓ Employment is expected to increase 25% in that same time frame

Connectivity

✓ The project will enhance connectivity to employment centers, schools, and recreational facilities







Needs of Project – Modal Interrelationships





Truck, Transit, Bicycle, and Pedestrian Needs

- Part of the National Highway Freight Network
 - ✓ About 9% of traffic are trucks
- Serves premium express transit routes for Broward County and Miami-Dade County.
- At the interchanges:
 - ✓ There are sidewalks on both sides of the arterials passing underneath the SR 9/I-95 bridges
 - ✓ There is opportunity to provide at-grade bicycle facilities along roadway arterials.






