- 1. Look for sharp objects
- 2. Practice safe storage
- 3. Repair damaged or worn containers
- 4. Properly label containers

- Identity of spilled material (if known)
- 2. Estimated area impacted
- 3. Estimated volume of spill
- 4. Entered MS4 or waterbody?

Reporting Procedures for Spill Response



Containment Steps

- 1. Proceed if you feel safe!
- 2. Stay up wind of spill
- 3. Wear proper PPE
- 4. Set up cones or barricades
- 5. Place absorbents on spill
- 6. Divert spill away from inlets or bodies of water

Non-Reportable Spill

- 1. Known material
- 2. Can be safely contained
- 3. On impervious service
- 4. Does not enter waters

Reportable Spill

- 1. Unknown material
- 2. Do not feel safe
- 3. Into waters or storm sewer
- 4. Spills requiring state notification
