

Westshore Transportation Action Plan Update

- The Westshore Transportation Action Plan was developed by the Westshore Alliance to provide a blueprint for addressing the mobility needs of the Westshore District from 2018-2045. The Action Plan is available at ChooseWestshore.com.
- The Action Plan has 104 projects, including 28 previously unplanned projects that were identified in meetings with stakeholders. Of those 28, ten of them are being studied, designed, funded, or under construction as of July 2020.
- In the last year, 70 Action Plan projects have advanced into a stage of development or remain in the previous stage. The Westshore Interchange and Tampa Bay Next funding approved in October 2019 will benefit 23 Action Plan projects.



- **Notable projects advanced in 2020**

- New sidewalks on Manhattan Ave. and Rocky Point Dr.
- Manhattan Ave./Boy Scout Blvd. traffic signal study.
- Westshore Alliance mural at Grady Ave. / Laurel St. ahead of new four-way stop.
- Three new bike racks/fix-it stations in Westshore.
- Completion of I-275 and SR 60 operational improvements ahead of schedule.

- **Notable projects starting in 2021**

- New HART service on Cypress St. between Westshore and Downtown.
- Study/design of a new trail on right-of-way connecting Spruce St. to Lois Ave. via Grady Ave. and a canal.
- Bike lanes and sharrows to connect to the I-275 Greenway.
- Additional street murals, pedestrian activation projects, and bike racks/fix-it stations.



- The Alliance and our members remain active in advocating for Westshore transportation improvements, including:

- The Alliance was named the 2019 Florida Bicycle Association Supporting Agency of The Year in March 2020.
- HART realigned services in Westshore to better serve riders from the northwest and downtown, as requested by the Alliance.
- Action Plan projects remain on the All For Transportation project lists, including Complete Street treatments on Cypress St., Lois Ave., Spruce St., and West Shore Blvd.
