ABOUT THE STUDY

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has initiated a Project Development and Environment (PD&E) Study along **S.R.714/Monterey Road at FEC Railroad Crossing in Martin County, Florida**.

Monterey Road is currently operating at an overall Level of Service (LOS) of D and is expected to operate at a LOS of E by 2040, according to the Martin County MPO FEC Railroad Grade Separation Feasibility Study (2017). Although the current LOS is considered satisfactory, an LOS E is considered unsatisfactory.

A contributing factor to the traffic congestion is the number of trains crossing through the Monterey Road/FEC railroad crossing. Therefore, improvements to this crossing would greatly reduce congestion within the project area and would support the current and future transportation demand within the project study area.

The purpose of this project is to improve traffic operations, establish more efficient road system connectivity, provide enhanced emergency evacuation, and improve sidewalk and bike lane network. This project, which originated based on community wants and a recognized safety need, strengthens the local community by making it easier and safer for people to drive, walk, and bike within the project area, while supporting operations for the FEC Railroad and Witham Field Airport. By improving road and rail infrastructure, resiliency, and improving emergency evacuation routes, the project will help the community stay connected and protected.

The analysis encompasses various build alternatives alongside a "No Build" scenario, emphasizing the importance of considering all options to optimize operations and safety, particularly focusing on Level of Service (LOS) improvements at signalized intersections within the study's area of influence.
