# Positioning Florida as a Global Trade Hub

Supply chain disruptions have had a significant effect on the global economy over the last few years. These disruptions have resulted from a variety of factors including a global pandemic [COVID 19], geopolitical unrest [Russia's invasion of Ukraine], and transportation system failures [Suez Canal blockage, ongoing West Coast congestion]. Preparation for any one type of disruption can take significant resources. For Florida's seaports, this has consisted of an ongoing decades long effort to continue to grow and modernize, deepening and widening navigation channels, expanding terminal capacity and operational efficiency, improving on-port/on-dock intermodal rail service, and streamlining first/last mile roadway access for trucks.

The State of Florida, through FDOT, has been a key funding partner for the last 30 years, helping to accelerate key maritime projects throughout the state [PortMiami Tunnel and deep dredge, JAXPORT deep dredge, Port Everglades Southport Turning Notch, Port Tampa Bay Crosstown Connector]. In addition to key connector and terminal improvements, the state also has led efforts to prepare and expand the inland logistics systems necessary to move cargo to market [truck parking availability system, improved access to intermodal terminals, expansion of key highway corridors]. Other key partners, including the Florida Chamber Foundation, have worked to advance the state of the Florida as a global trade hub through efforts like the recently completed third installment of the Florida Trade and Logistics Study [T&L 2030].

Currently, FDOT has an initiative underway to further explore the state's intermodal logistics center (ILC) strategy to help promote and enhance further growth in international trade. This will complement efforts by Florida's seaports, like PortMiami's NetZero Cargo Supply Chain Program. In addition, the state will host a statewide supply chain symposium in January 2023 to bring the state's industry and government agencies together to further enhance the state's preparedness and competitiveness.

# **Blue Origin, Composites Assembly Facility Project**

Cape Canaveral Spaceport

Blue Origin's Composites Assembly Facility Project was approved for funding in the FDOT Spaceport Improvement Program. This project is part of the overall Orbital Launch Site & Support Facility that will support heavy lift launch operations, space vehicle composite manufacturing, and a production test support facility. When constructed, it will create greater capability to reuse rockets, expands launch capacity and cadence at Cape Canaveral. The facility is designed to support customer specifications and meet a production rate of at least 12 launches per year.

The FDOT Spaceport Office provided a total of \$9.25 million (\$2.32 million in FY22 and \$6.93 million in FY23).
