503 Public Workshops



A public workshop refers to an informal gathering, held at a designated location, where individuals review project-related materials, talk with project team members, and provide comments. Sometimes also known as community forums or

open houses, what makes workshops distinct is that they allow attendees to work with maps, discuss specific project topics, and provide suggestions.

Public workshops require all the same notification requirements as a public meeting, including ads in the Florida Administrative Register (FAR) and on the Department's website. Workshops are great for planning, corridor, or feasibility studies or when you need hands-on or specific input/interaction from the public.
