# FEDERAL PERFORMANCE **MEASURES: STATE AND MPO TARGETS**

May 2025

Federal law requires the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), metropolitan planning organizations (MPO), and transit providers to establish and report targets for performance measures that assess road safety, bridge and pavement condition, system performance, transit asset management, and transit safety. FDOT and transit providers establish targets for their planning areas. MPOs may support the targets established by FDOT or the transit providers or establish their own targets for the MPO area. This document summarizes the statewide and MPO targets for the current performance period.

# **HIGHWAY PERFORMANCE MEASURES**

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) established performance measures for: roadway safety, bridge and pavement condition, and system performance.

## SAFETY TARGETS

**Statewide Targets** 

State DOTs and MPOs must set targets for five performance measures that assess the number and rate of fatalities and serious injuries on all public roads, including specific targets related to vulnerable road users. FDOT established statewide targets in August 2024 for calendar year 2025. Given FDOT's firm belief that every life counts, the statewide target for each safety performance measure is zero. A total of 21 MPOs supported the statewide targets for 2025. Six MPOs established

## **BRIDGE CONDITION TARGETS**

State DOTs and MPOs must set targets for the percentage of bridges on National Highway System (NHS) roads that are in Good or Poor condition. FDOT established statewide targets in December 2022 for bridge condition in 2023 and 2025. All

MPOs adopted the statewide targets. FDOT revised the 2025 targets in October 2024.

## PAVEMENT CONDITION TARGETS

State DOTs and MPOs must set targets for the percentage of pavements on NHS roads that are in Good or Poor condition. FDOT established statewide targets in December 2022 for pavement condition in 2023 and 2025. All MPOs adopted the statewide targets with the exception of Forward Pinellas, which set higher targets for pavement condition on the non-Interstate

portion of the NHS.

#### SYSTEM PERFORMANCE TARGETS

State DOTs and MPOs must set targets to assess the reliability of passenger and truck freight travel on NHS roads. FDOT established statewide targets in December 2022 for system performance in 2023 and 2025. A total of 24 MPOs supported all the

statewide targets, and three set their own targets for at least one of the measures or years. FDOT revised the 2025 target for the reliability of person-miles traveled on the interstate in October 2024.

# TRANSIT PERFORMANCE MEASURES

The Federal Transit Administration (FTA) established performance measures for transit asset management and public transportation safety and requires certain providers of public transportation to annually establish targets and report performance. Providers must share their targets with each MPO in which provider's projects and services are programmed in the MPO's transportation improvement program (TIP). Those MPOs may either support the provider's targets or also set transit asset management and safety targets for their planning area. Current transit provider and MPO targets may be requested from individual transit providers and MPOs.
