

WHO WILL TAKE THE LEAD?



FHWA will approve NEPA documents for local agencies who receive grant funds directly from the federal government (no involvement with FDOT)

FDOT will approve NEPA documents for local agencies who are co-applicants with FDOT or who have a LAP Agreement with FDOT for the project

CONSIDERATIONS FOR LOCAL AGENCIES PURSUING GRANTS

Is the grant the primary source for **funding** the project?

What is the **scope** of the project? *(Note that larger or more-impactful projects require longer durations for NEPA Study and approval)*

When should the NEPA Study begin in order to meet the project **schedule** required by the grant?

Does the local agency want to enter into a **LAP agreement** with FDOT to administer grant funds?
