




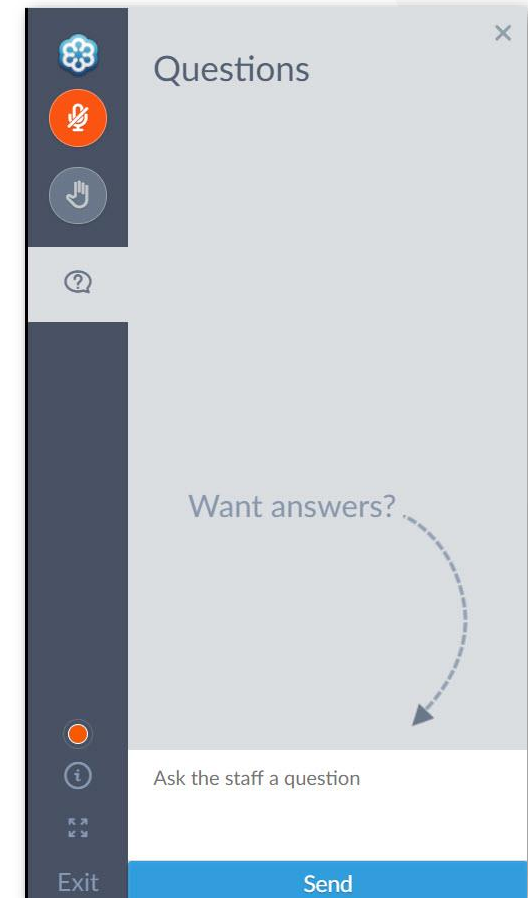

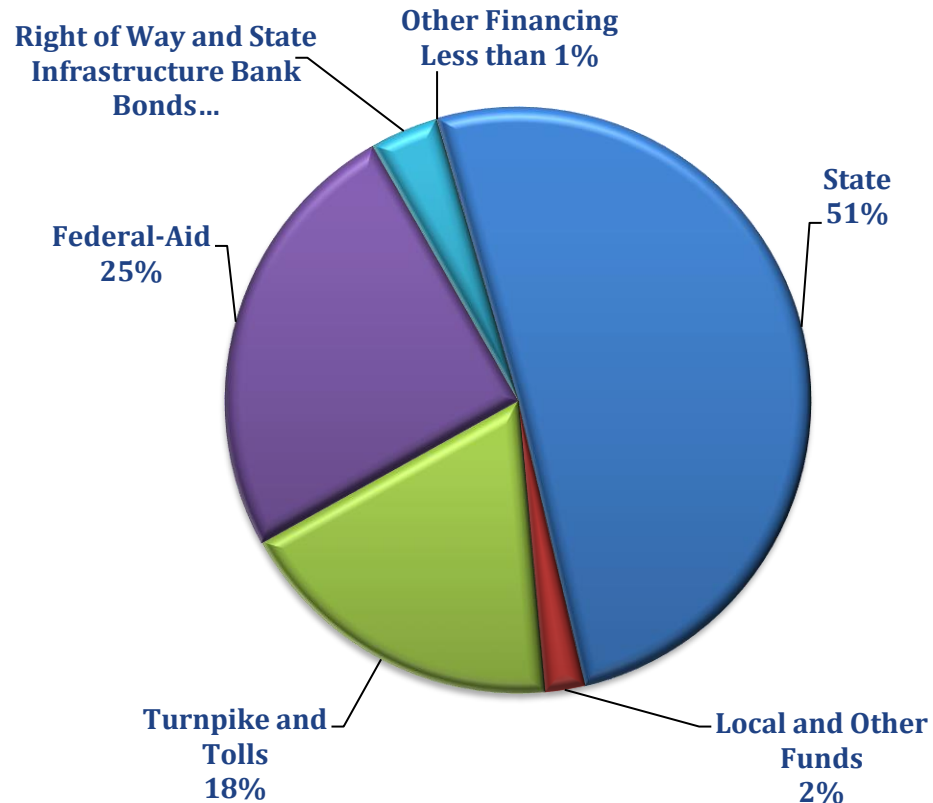


U.S. DOT PRIORITIES TO IMPROVE THE NATION'S TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM

\$9.47 billion for the State Transportation Work Program

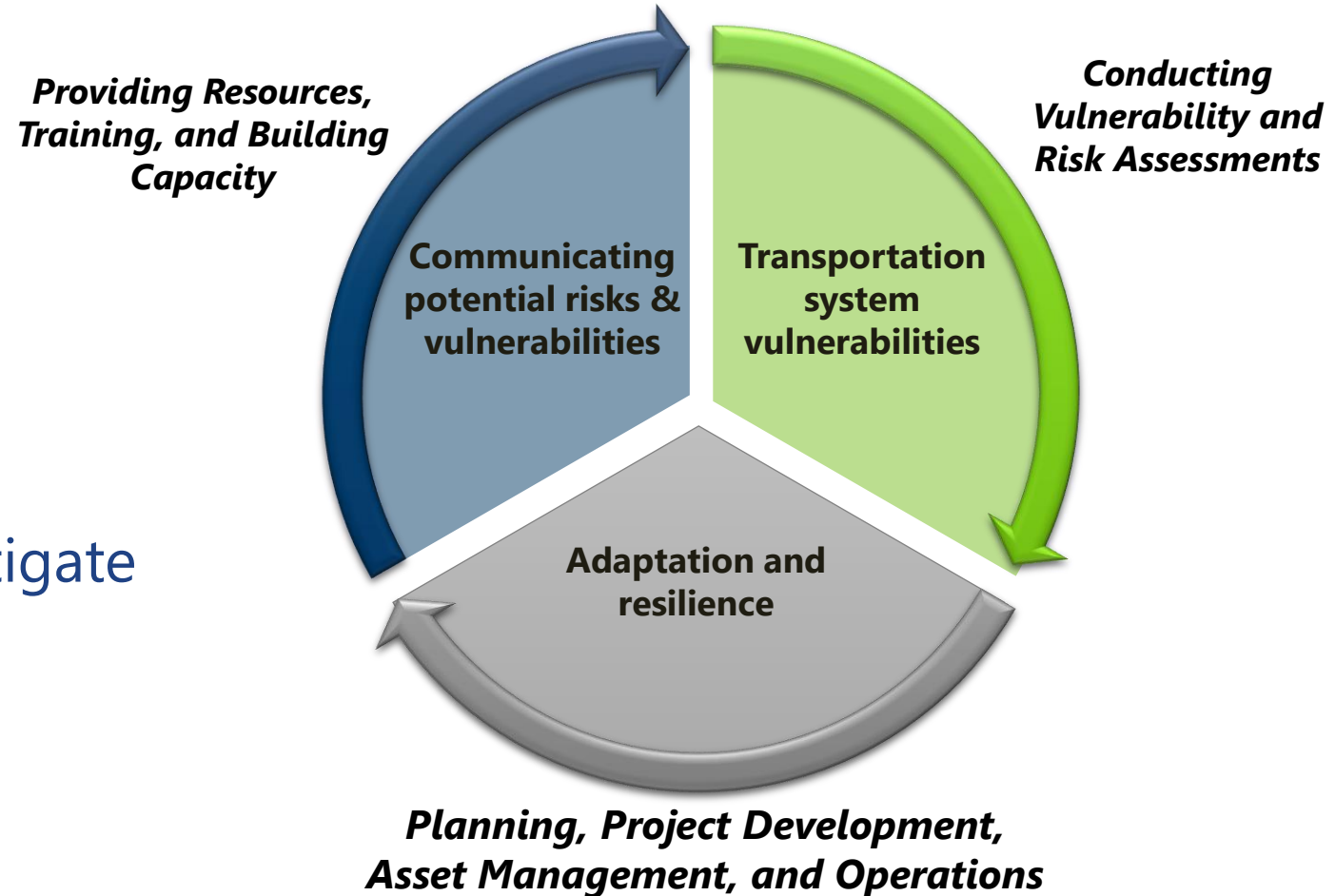

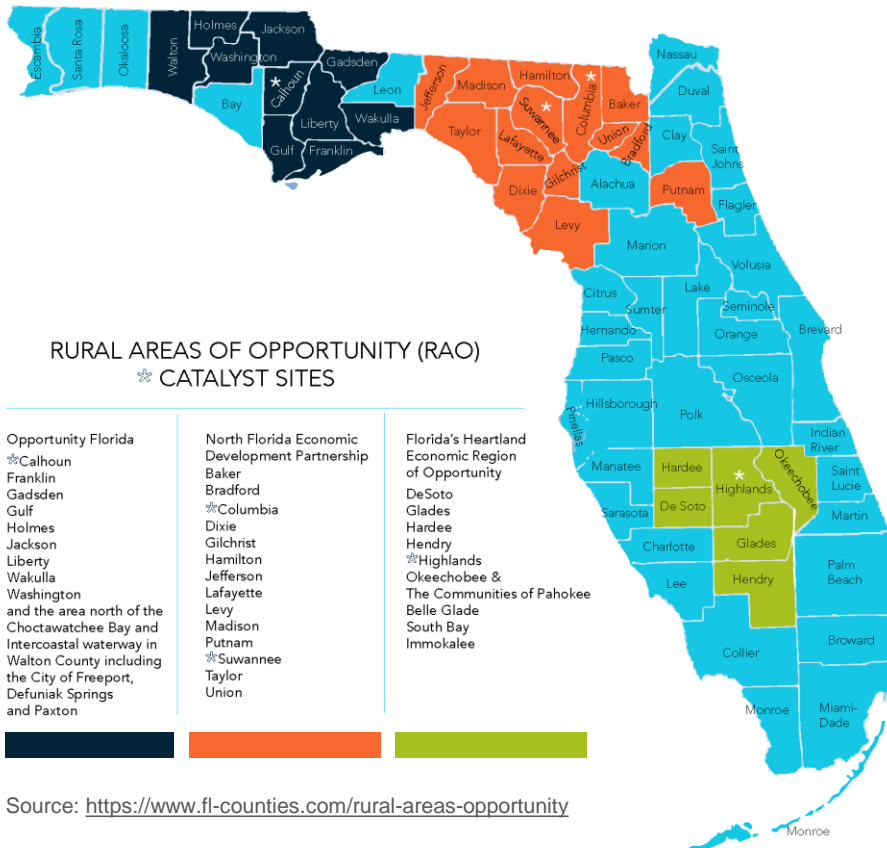
**\$50 million for the Economic Development

RESILIENCY OF STATE TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE POLICY

- Identify Risks
 - Storms
 - Flooding
 - Sea Level Rise
- Assess Potential Impacts
- Employ Strategies to avoid, mitigate or eliminate impacts



BROADBAND INFRASTRUCTURE PROGRAM



Funding: \$5 million, annually

Purpose of Program

- Support broadband infrastructure within or adjacent to a multi-use corridor
- Provide priority consideration to Rural Areas of Opportunity

ELECTRIC VEHICLE MASTER PLAN

“Coordinate, develop, and recommend a Master Plan for electric vehicle charging station infrastructure along the SHS.”

Goals of the Master Plan

- Short and Long-Range Travel Charging
- Expansion of EV Use Statewide
- Serve Florida’s Evacuation Routes



ELECTRIC VEHICLE MASTER PLAN RECOMMENDATIONS

Lead: Lead the adoption of electrified mobility by providing infrastructure.

Build: Support the transition of electrified mobility through investing in the next generation of EV infrastructure.

Educate: Generate, collect, and distribute the information and knowledge needed to support the state's electrification goals.

Coordinate: Engage with the stakeholders and communities to coordinate electrification efforts.

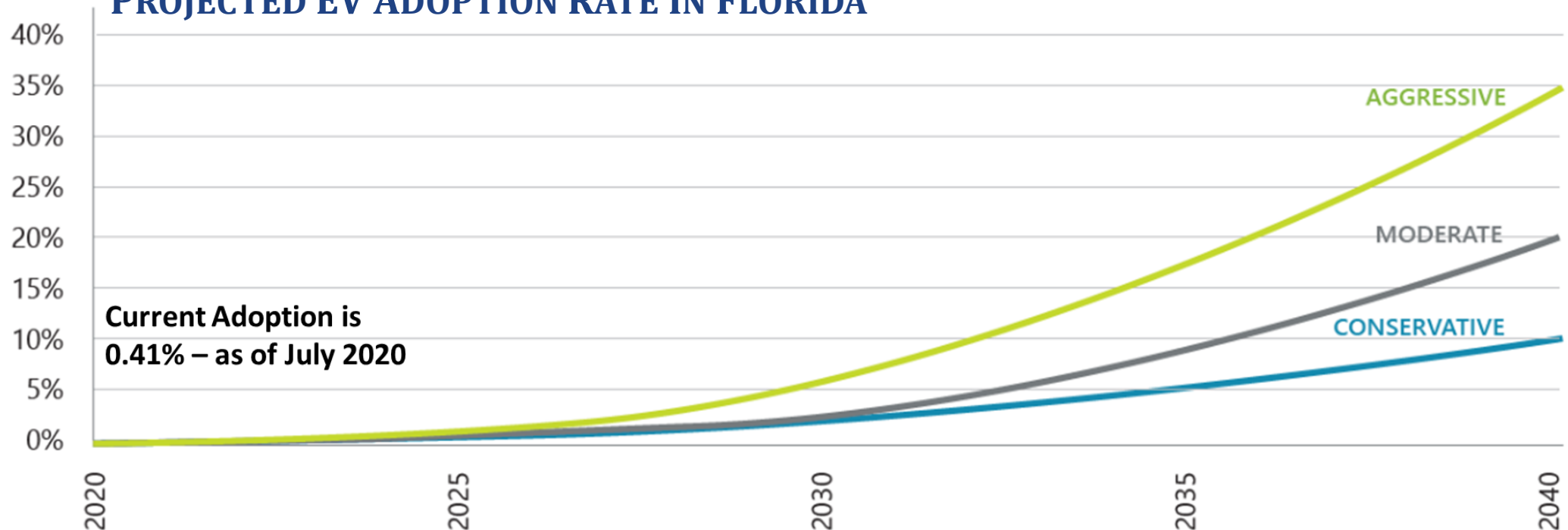
Fund: Proactively plan for new revenue streams and support additional investment in infrastructure to support EVs.
