



Strategic Intermodal System Military Access Facility

To plan for an efficient and safe transportation network in Florida, the state legislature and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) developed the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS). As part of the SIS, there are specific elements that have been identified as critical to the economic success of Florida. One of these elements Military Access Facilities (MAFs), which serve as connectors for military installations in Florida to the nearest SIS Facility.

The adjacent table lists all the MAFs within Florida and their SIS designations as defined by the criteria that were put forth by FDOT. Of note are efforts to rebuild Tyndall AFB following the devastating impacts of Hurricane Michael in 2018, and Camp Blanding's ongoing status as a Governor's Continuity of Government site.



Designated MAFs




