



Strategic Intermodal System Passenger Terminals

To plan for an efficient and safe transportation network in Florida, the state legislature and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) developed the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS). As part of the SIS, there are specific elements that have been identified as critical to the economic success of Florida. One of these elements are passenger terminals, whose main purpose is to move passengers within and outside the State of Florida.

The adjacent table lists all the passenger terminals within Florida and their SIS designations as defined by the criteria that were established by FDOT. Through the 2016 SIS Policy Plan update, the SIS promoted co-location of passenger terminals for SIS designation as a way to meet goals of the Florida Transportation Plan. For a passenger terminal to have a SIS designation, it must either have 100,000 annual regional bus and/or regional rail passengers or it must be co-located with another interregional transit mode and have 50,000 annual regional bus and/or regional rail passengers.




