



Strategic Intermodal System Spaceports

In order to plan for an efficient and safe transportation network in Florida, the state legislature and Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) developed the Strategic Intermodal System (SIS). As part of the SIS, there are specific elements that have been identified as critical to the economic success of Florida. One of these elements are spaceports, whose main purpose is to provide companies in Florida with sufficient opportunities to conduct needed launches and area for research and development.

The primary criteria for determining whether a spaceport be considered for inclusion in the SIS is whether there are “regularly scheduled civil, commercial, or military launches resulting in suborbital or orbital flights”.
