# **Timucuan Trail**

For over 20 years local, state, and federal government and nonprofit partners have been working to develop the Timucuan Trail to connect culturally rich and ecologically diverse resources along Florida's northeast coast. Beginning in 2018, the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail program awarded design and subsequently construction funds totaling over \$3 million for extending the 10-foot-wide, one-and-a-half-mile segment along the east side of State Road A1A, also known as Heckscher Drive with bridges over Simpson and Myrtle creeks. The project extends from the entrance of Little Talbot Island State Park to Big Talbot Island State Park's Big Pine Trailhead, north of Houston Avenue.

Established in 2015 under Section 339.81, Florida Statutes, the SUN Trail program receives an annual allocation from the redistribution of new vehicle tag revenues deposited in the State Transportation Trust Fund. Administration of the program is by the Florida Department of Transportation's (FDOT) Systems Implementation Office. The competitively awarded funding is one source for expanding a safe statewide system of interconnected, high priority, and strategic paved multiuse trails (SUN Trail network) for bicyclists and pedestrians and to connect Florida's Wildlife Corridors.
