- The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) solicitation for proposals for funding Regional Trail System and Individual Trail projects through the Shared-Use Nonmotorized (SUN) Trail program, established by Section 339.81, Florida Statutes (F.S.) [TLWR-fund code] for inclusion in the Tentative Five-Year Work Program development cycle through Fiscal Years 2028/2029.
- To be eligible for consideration to receive TLWR, applicants must submit a separate, complete “Request for Funding”, with all applicable project information, including required signatures for each eligible unfunded Regional or Individual Trail project through the Grant Application Process online system (GAP) during the open solicitation: www.flgap.com
- The solicitation period will open on September 29, 2022, and close at 3:00 p.m., Eastern Standard Time (EST), December 15, 2022



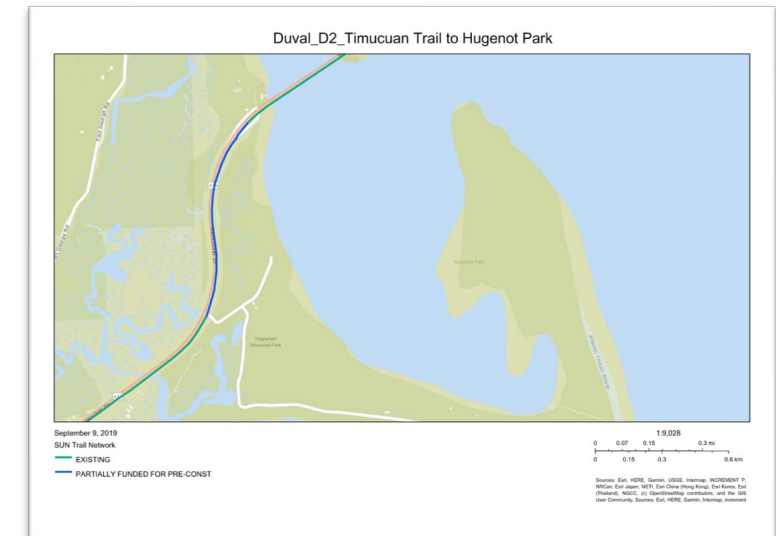

A shapefile is an Environmental Systems Research Institute (Esri) vector data storage format for storing the location, shape, and attributes of geographic features. The SUN Trail data is a set of related files and it is provided in an archived (.zip) file format to download and to import into ArcGIS programs. The shapefiles contain measures which can be used for event mapping of tabular data that contains mile point information corresponding to the TDA Roadway Characteristics Inventory (RCI) Features and Characteristics, the SUN Trail network is **Feature 801**.

KMZ is an archived KML (Keyhole Markup Language) file, which is used to display geographic information in Google Earth. To open the KMZ file you must have the Google Earth Application on your computer. Upon opening the KMZ file, the SUN Trail network data will be added as a map overlay. Then you can select the file from your computer to Open Data in either Google Maps (with a Google account) or Bing Maps (with a Microsoft account).

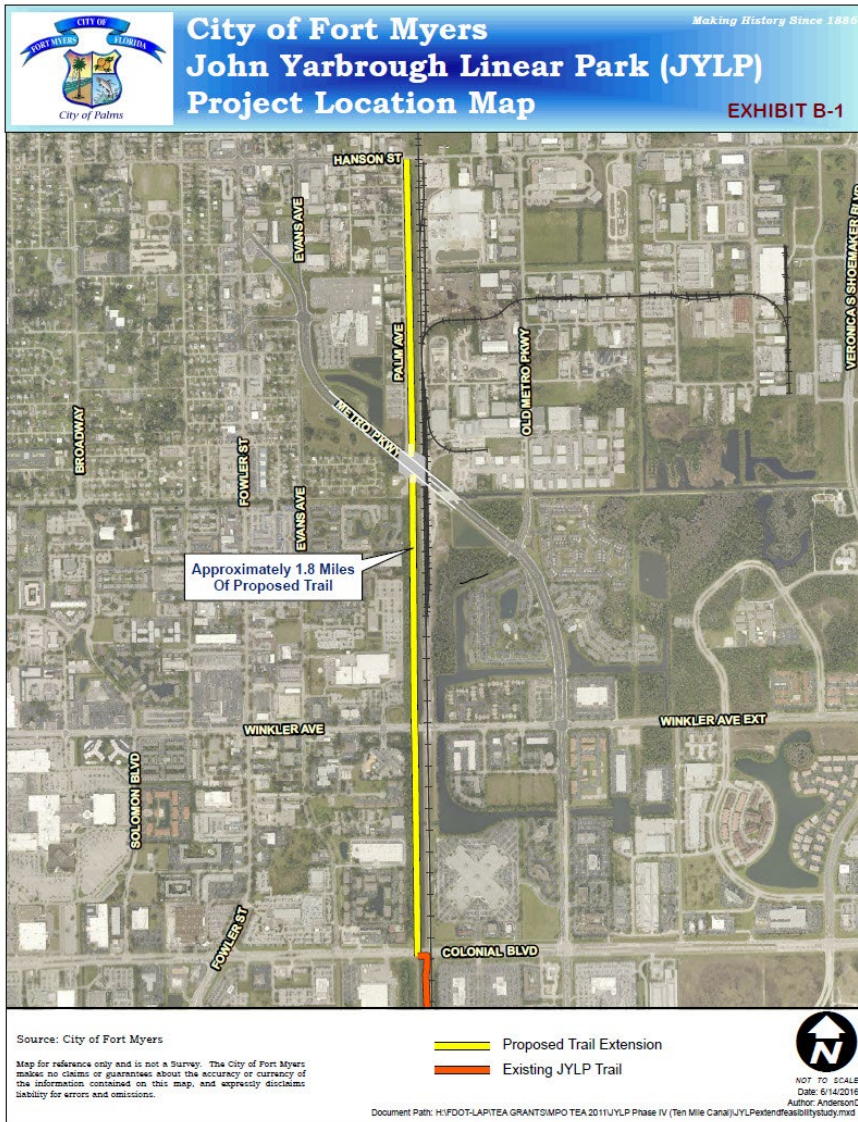

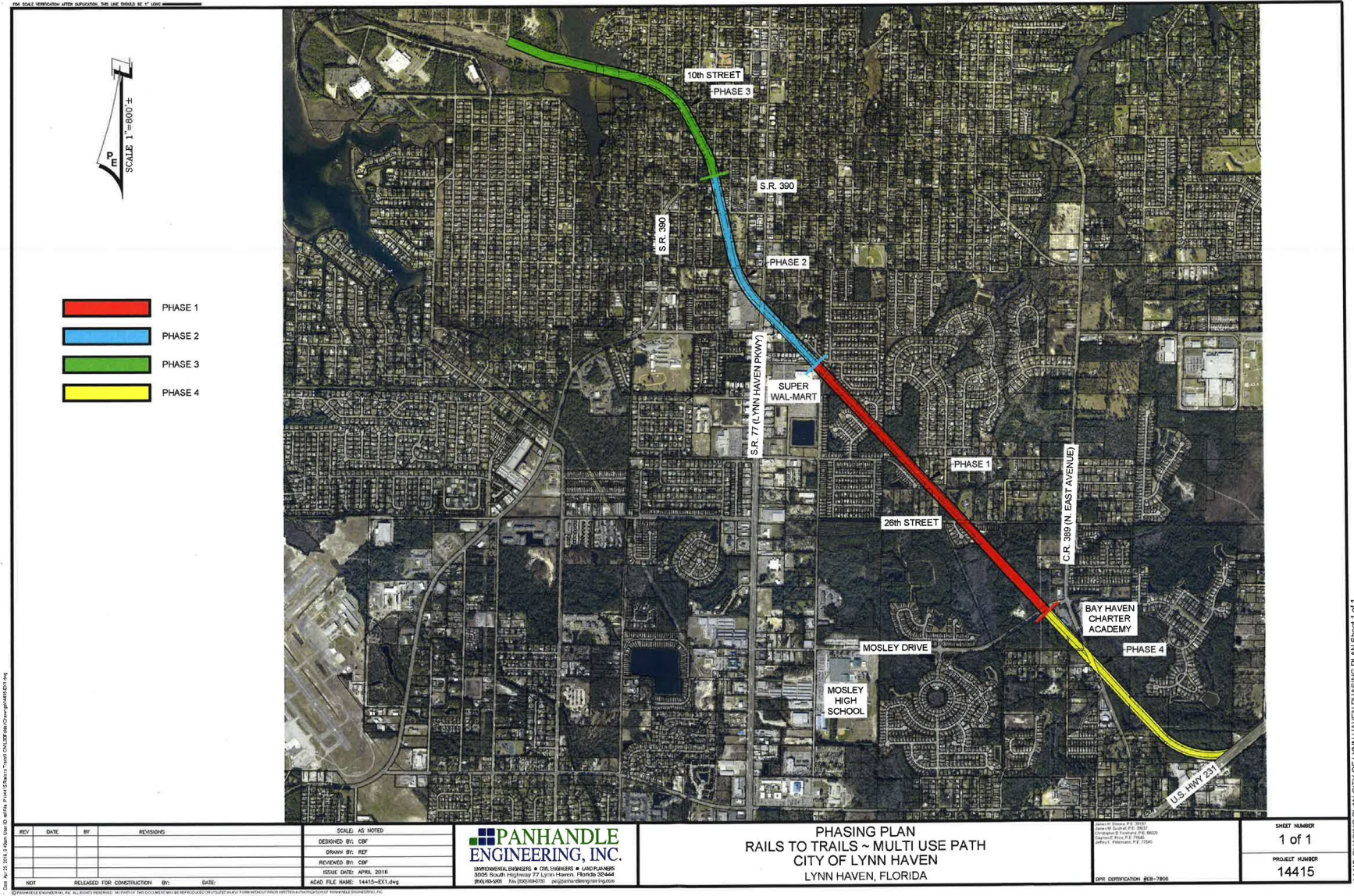

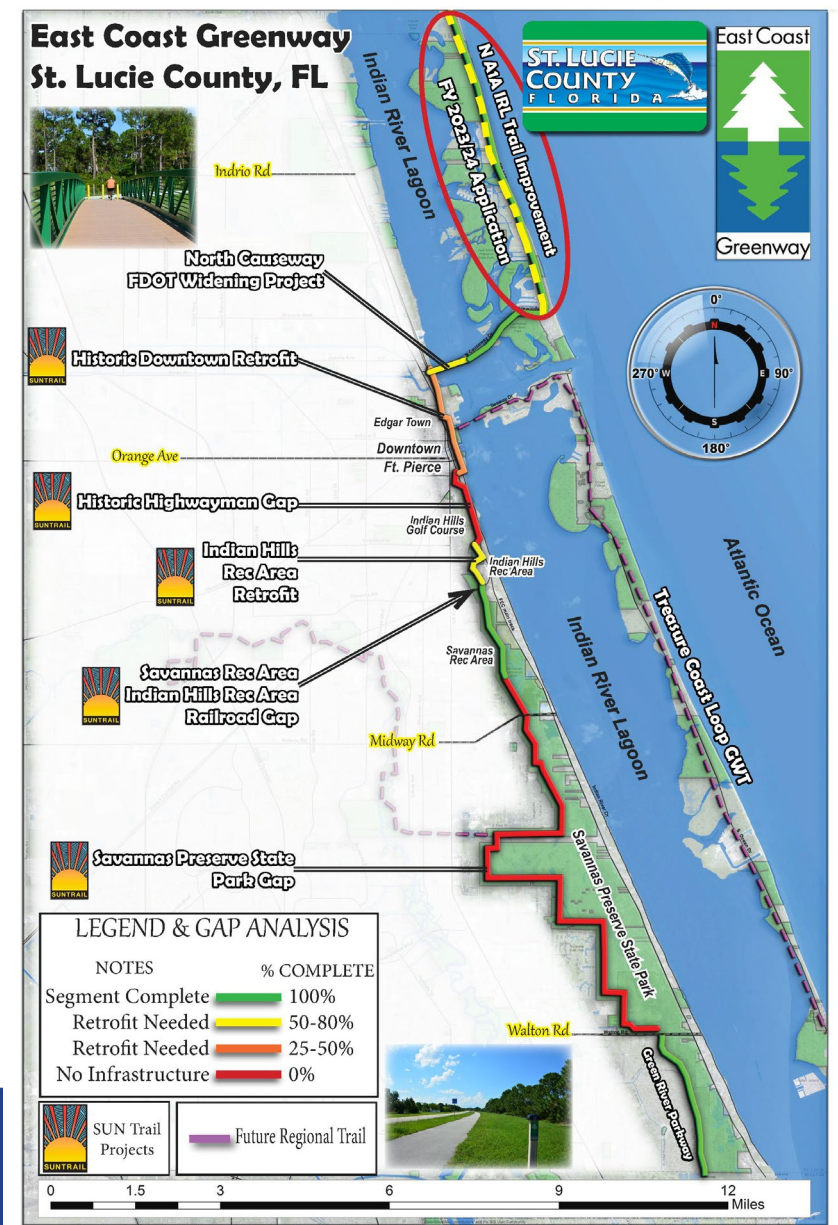


Example Aerial Map of Project Location from Previous Year

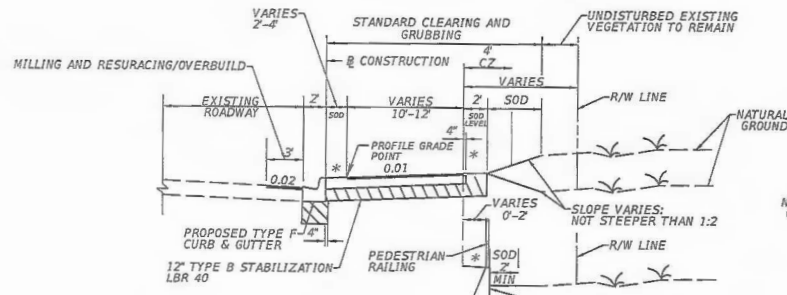

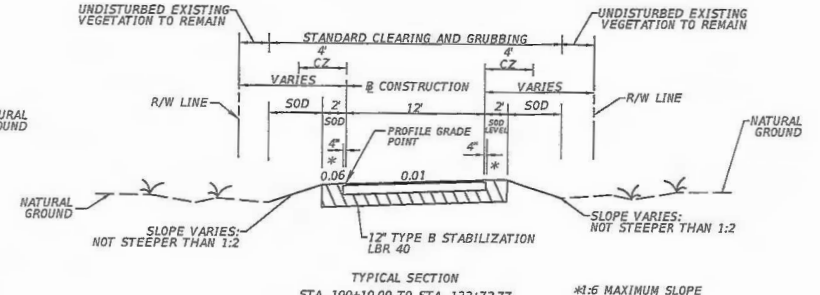

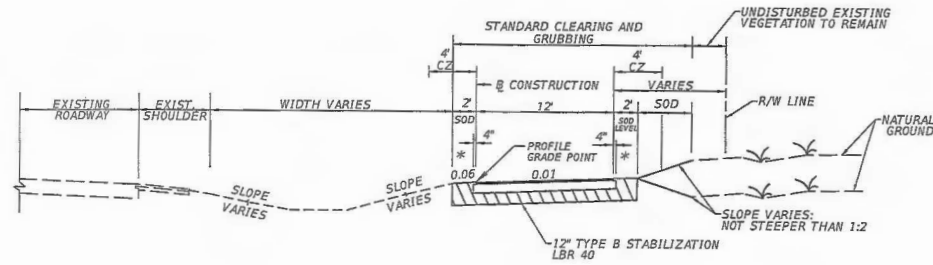

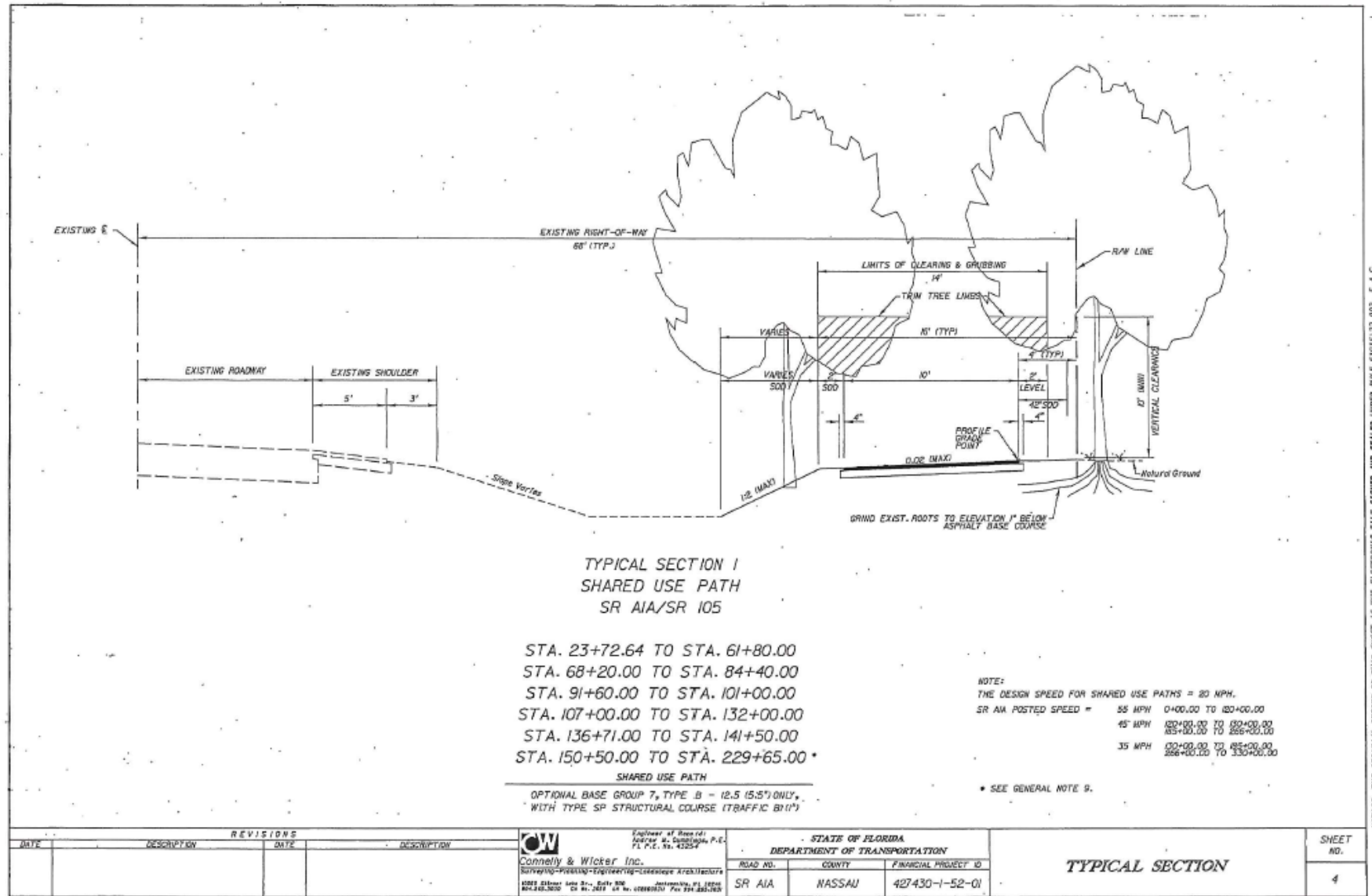

MIDDLE BEACH


Middle Beach encompasses the neighborhoods between Dade Boulevard in the South to 63 Street in the North, and includes the communities of Allison Island, Bayshore, Nautilus, La Gorce, and Oceanfront. The mid beach community boasts some of the best real estate in the country, with their narrow, tree lined streets and adjacency to the beach.

As the Transportation Report Card Shows, most of the trips in this area are made by car. This is one of the most suburban parts of Miami Beach, and is heavily designed around the car. 41 Street is the only pedestrian corridor in the area, and **the beachwalk is the only protected bicycle facility.**


Within the network, La Gorce Neighborhood forms a critical connection between Nautilus to the South, and North Beach. There are only 6 north/south corridors in Mid-beach. Four of these converge at 63 street in La Gorce. Alton Road is a critical north-south auto-connection, with volumes and speeds that require protected facilities, but a protected facility along this corridor will be difficult to accomplish in the short term. This plan proposes two alternate low-stress routes that incorporate North Bay Road and the 2-mile Pine Tree/La Gorce pair.





residents, homeowners associations, and transportation committees. Each category of projects builds on previous efforts and tries to improve bicycle access incrementally with the goal of increasing bicycle mode-share. The projects identified in the BPMP have been included in the broader project bank for the City's TMP. The TMP project bank is intended to provide a comprehensive bank of projects and policies to guide multi-modal transportation improvements for the City over the next 20 years. However, it is recommended that the project bank be reviewed and updated every 5 years, to reflect updated mobility data and demographics. The projects in the Project Bank have been identified in three Priorities: Priority 1, Priority 2, and Priority 3. Criteria used to identify priorities included need, capacity benefits, connectivity benefits, safety benefits, ease of implementation, modal split impact. It is important to note that Priority 1 projects include existing initiatives that the City is working on as well as projects that have the potential to be implemented within the next 5 years. However, it is important to note that the actual timing of projects will be dependent on available funding as well as staffing resources. Funding requirements for the project bank are estimated as follows:

- Priority 1: \$452 million (including \$360 million for a Miami Beach Light Rail/Modern Streetcar project in South Beach).
- Priority 2: \$100 million
- Priority 3: \$485 million (including expansion of Light Rail/Modern Streetcar to other areas of the City)


Priority 1 projects are projected to increase person-trip corridor capacity by as much as 50% in some corridors.

The Miami Beach Street Design Guideline is intended to provide direction to engineers, city staff, and citizens in their ongoing work to provide safer streets for Miami Beach residents and visitors, beyond the project bank in the TMP.

A phase 1 Environmental Site Assessment (ESA) was conducted as part of the feasibility study and revealed evidence suggesting potential impacts to the project site related to recognized environmental conditions (REC's) associated with the historical use as an active rail line, previous industrial uses such as automotive repair stations, dry cleaning facilities, and the adjacent storage of above-ground storage tanks with unknown content.

The proposed project will restore and mitigate these areas through a Phase 2 ESA with recommendations for remediation and a timeline to implement these actions at the completion of this report. Full funding of the Phase 2 ESA has been identified by Sarasota County and The Friends of the Legacy Trail.

Additionally, a Stormwater Management Analysis was conducted as part of the feasibility study which incorporates water quality and drainage improvements through the limits of this project.

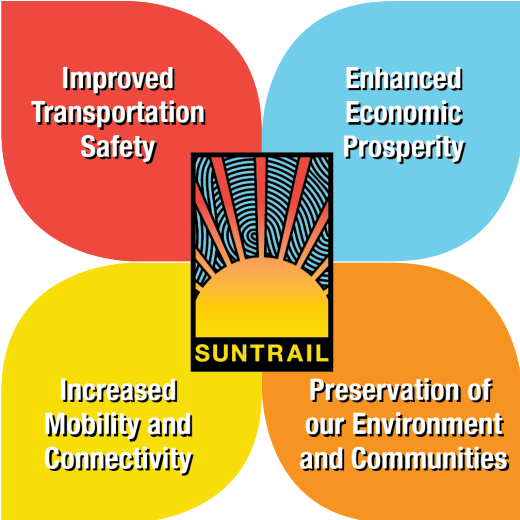
