SUN Trail Shapefile



A shapefile is an Environmental Systems Research Institute (Esri) vector data storage format for storing the location, shape, and attributes of geographic features. The SUN Trail data is a set of related files and it is provided in an archived (.zip) file format to download and to import into ArcGIS programs. The shapefiles contain measures which can be used for event mapping of tabular data that contains mile point information corresponding to the TDA Roadway Characteristics Inventory (RCI) Features and Characteristics, the SUN Trail network is Feature 801.

SUN Trail KMZ Zip File

Updated: July 28, 2022

KMZ is an archived KML (Keyhole Markup Language) file, which is used to display geographic information in Google Earth. To open the KMZ file you must have the Google Earth Application on your computer. Upon opening the KMZ file, the SUN Trail network data will be added as a map overlay. Then you can select the file from your computer to Open Data in either Google Maps (with a Google account) or Bing Maps (with a Microsoft account).









Between 2011 and 2014 the total number of crashes increased by 177 within the JYLP Trail Extension study area. Bicyclists and pedestrians were involved in 0.3 % and 0.5% respectively of all crashes, with 53.8% of these crashes occurring at intersections. 

Middle Beach encompasses the neighborhoods between Dade Boulevard in the South to 63 Street in the North, and includes the communities of Allison Island, Bayshore, Nautillus, La Gorce, and Oceanfront. The mid beach community boasts some of the best real estate in the country, with their narrow, tree lined streets and

As the Transportation Report Card Shows, most of the trips in this area are made by car. This is one of the most suburban parts of Miami Beach, and is heavily designed around the car. 41 Street is the only pedestrian corridor in the area, and the beachwalk is the only protected blovel facility.

Within the network, La Garce Neighborhood forms a critical connection between Naurillas to the South, and North Beach. There are only 6 north/south corridors in Mid-beach. Four of these converge at 63 street in La Garce. Alton Road is a critical north-south auto-connection, with volumes and speeds that require protected facilities, but a protected facility along this corridor will be difficult to accomplish in the short term. This plan proposes two alternate low-stress routes that incorporate North Bay Road and the 2-mile Pine Tree/La Garce pair.


