102-9-Temporary Traffic Control Devices.

102-9.1 General Installation and Maintenance: Use only devices that are listed on the APL. Install and maintain temporary traffic control devices as detailed in the Plans, Index 102-600 of the Standard Plans and when applicable, in accordance with the approved vendor drawings, as provided on the Department's Approved Product List (APL). Erect the required temporary traffic control devices to prevent any hazardous conditions and in conjunction with any necessary traffic re-routing to protect the traveling public, workers, and to safeguard the work area. Use only those devices that are on the APL or meeting the requirements of the Standard Plans. Immediately remove or cover, using any method approved by the Engineer, any existing or temporary devices that do not apply to current existing conditions.

The use of NCHRP Report 350 Recommended Procedures for the Safety Performance Evaluation of Highway Features devices purchased prior to January 1, 2020 is permitted on projects let prior to January 1, 2030. All devices purchased on or after January 1, 2020 must be MASH compliant in accordance with Section 990.

The APL number is to be permanently marked on the device at a readily visible location. Sheeting used on devices and pavement markings is exempt from this marking requirement.

1. 102-9.1 - 1st Paragraph, 2nd sentence: Consider replacing sentence with - "Immediately remove or cover devices that do not apply to current conditions as approved by the Engineer." 2. 102-9.1 - 4th Paragraph, 1st sentence: Consider replacing section of sentence after Engineer in writing with "of any scheduled activity that will affect traffic patterns or operation in advance of commencing such activity with enough time to permit review of the proposed installation plan of temporary traffic control devices." 3. 102-9.1 - 6th Paragraph, last sentence: Remove word "clean" before "damaged" to read: "replace damaged, defaced or dirty devices." - next sentence mentions that "devices must not be cleaned while installed / used. 4. 102-9.1 - 8th Paragraph, 3rd sentence: Delete this sentence because it is already mentioned in the second sentence of this paragraph. 5. 102-11.20 - 2nd Paragraph, 1st sentence: This line is not clear on payment. If it is the actual stripe from begin to end of line then it should read after "dotted lines" - "will be the actual length of tape excluding space from begin to end, in linear feet," 6. 102-13.19 - 1st Paragraph, 1st sentence: Instead of "protection of traffic" Replace "of" with from to read - "protection from traffic" 7. 102-13.25 - Item No. 102-911-: no unit of payment included - per linear ft or per foot 8. 102-13.25 - Item No. 102-912-: unit of payment included - per linear ft or per foot
