If HB 287 passes, it will require the use of LAP division specs, how will it apply to LAP Class D off-system projects?

Ramon thinks off system will be the FL Greenbook, that's what statute says.

Ramon said FDOT comes to FACERS meeting in June and when there is a legislative conference meeting. Ramon has face time in FACERS with FDOT staff.

Samantha asked if anyone is opposed to taking it down to twice a year.

Deborah S. in Sumter County agrees with meeting twice a year instead of four.

Amanda L. works in FDOT Policy Planning with Federal Discretionary Grants wants everyone to know if they have any questions for her or agenda items in the future to feel free to ask.

Steve B. wanted the group to know if we have the meeting twice a year instead of four times we could still convene if needed more than twice a year per request of locals, FDOT or FHWA staff.

City Participation in LAP CoP

Selena Griffett City of Fort Pierce mentioned that she asked two years ago if she could sit in on meetings. Looking at our LAP CoP website she mentioned seeing representation from FDOT, FHWA, APWA, and FACERS, but didn't see as much from local Cities. What opportunities do Cities have to take part in this group? Your program does work well, but I don't see any interactions with the Cities. City of Port Saint Lucy for example isn't on the LAP CoP. SS4A money was granted to City of Ft Pierce. Can Cities participate with LAP and FHWA in another forum, since not many are here?

John G. said Cities don't have a formal organization the way counties do with the exception of the League of Cities. John said there's a vehicle of participation through FACERS where FACERS can represent Cities. That option is available through the existing structure we have.

Contract Documents Template Request

One struggle Selena has is having to create contract documents that meet requirements for State and Federal funding. Would it be advantageous to make a standard document or template that agencies use, so everyone is using the same document?

Samantha mentioned LAP has the [forms site](#), that has documents like LAP agreement, but Cities agreement with consultants they hire to do work is their agreement. Ramon invited Selena to FACERS. Selena has been in FL for 7 years. She used to be in W. Virginia and Pennsylvania.

Nahir said there is a community of practice for SS4A. That is specifically for direct recipients.

Steve B. stated working directly with the districts as well is an option for receiving help with contracts or other LAP questions. District 4 has Mya and Sabrina who can provide technical

assistance. Steve mentioned if Selena saw a best practice in another State she's worked in she can bring those benefits to the FL group. This LAP CoP group is a smaller representation of the industry. Steve hopes the D4 team can help.

Selena does participate in the SS4A LAP CoP. Selena is in touch with Mya and Sabrina.

Ramon said FACERS doesn't have a City organization but you can join FACERS.

Samantha mentioned she'll work on the date for the next meeting.

Next Meeting Dates

Currently the meetings are scheduled quarterly, but per the above conversation we are proposing to leadership we change the meeting frequency to twice a year. We will notify everyone once a decision is made.

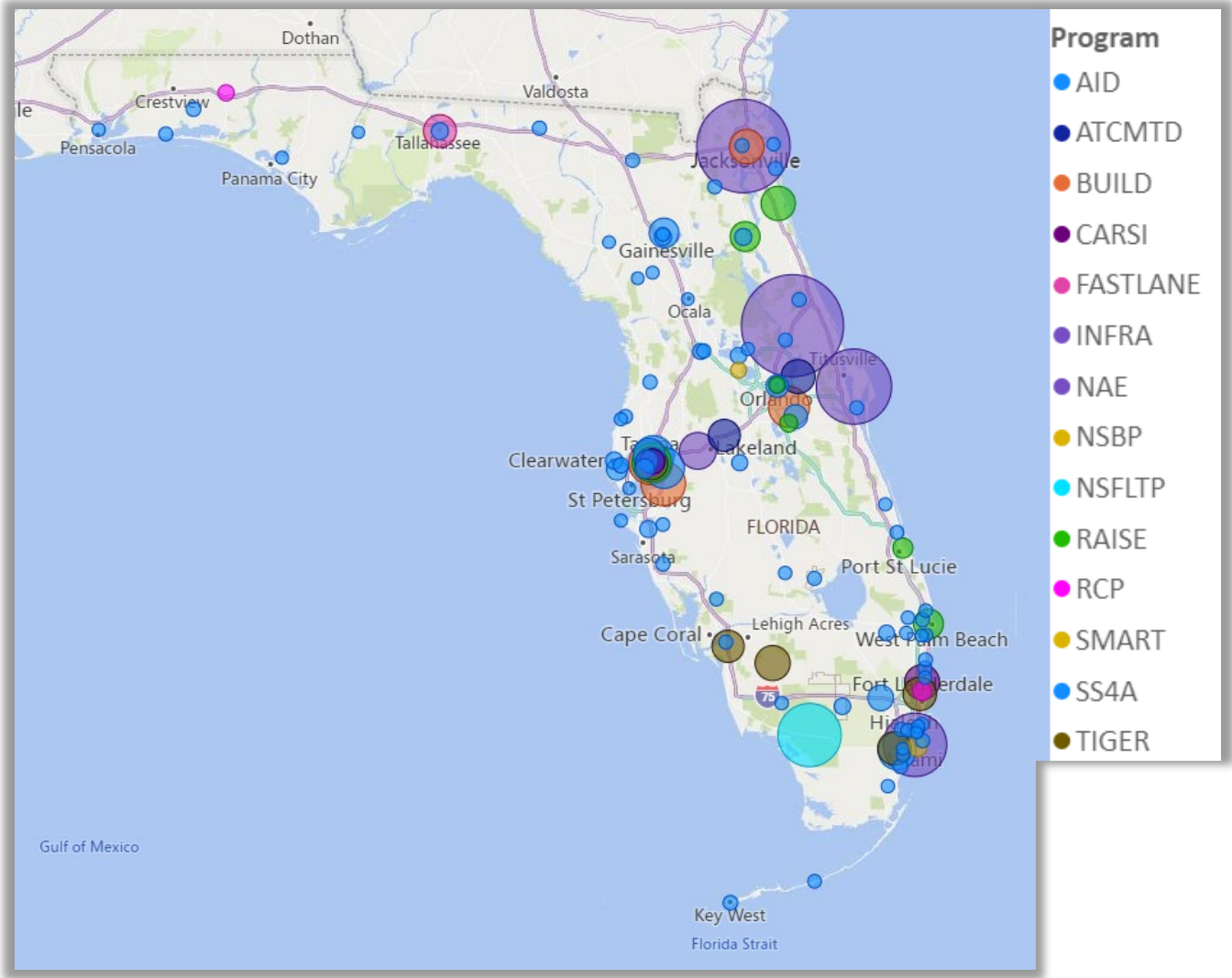

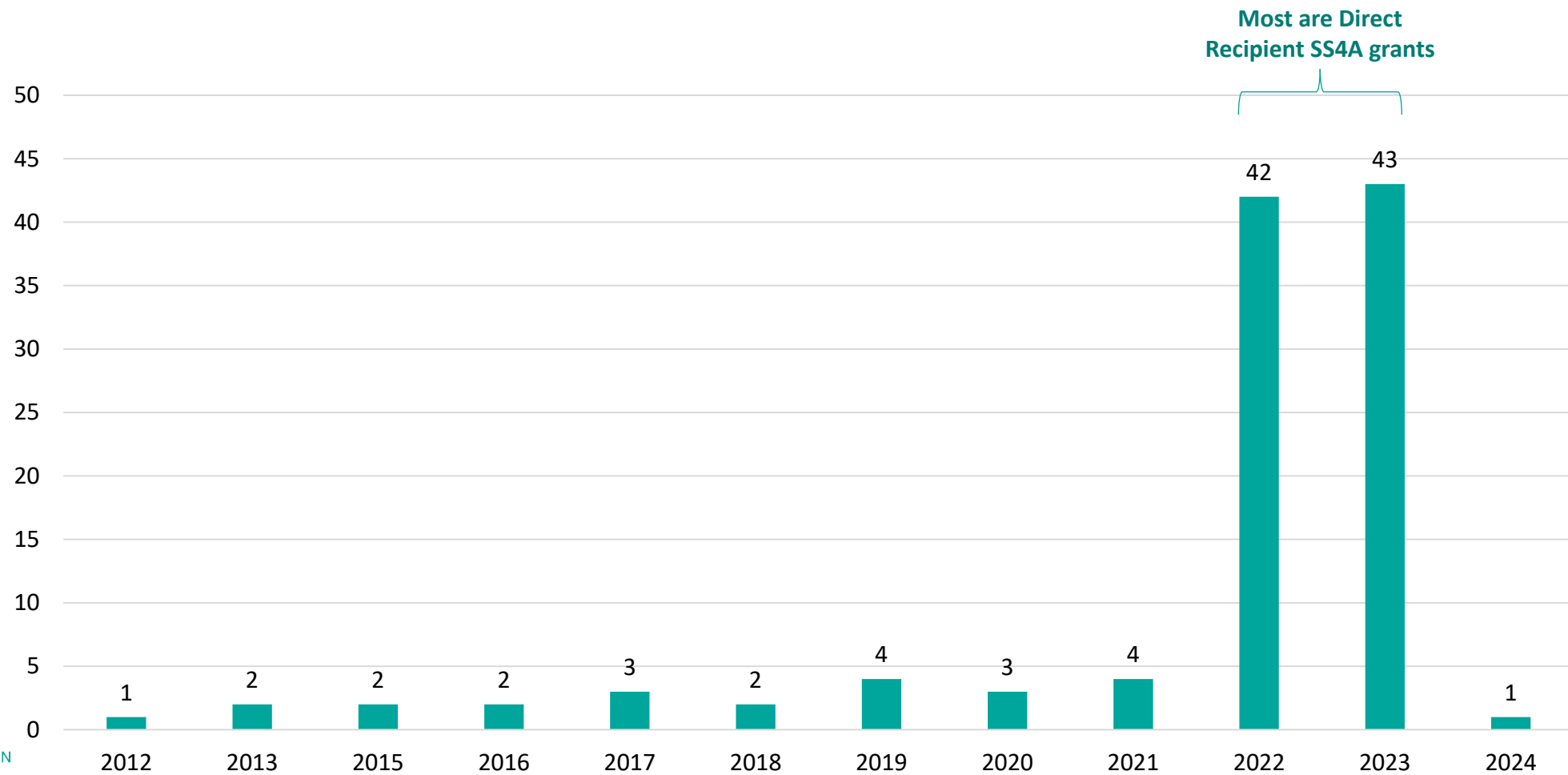

Number of Grants Awarded

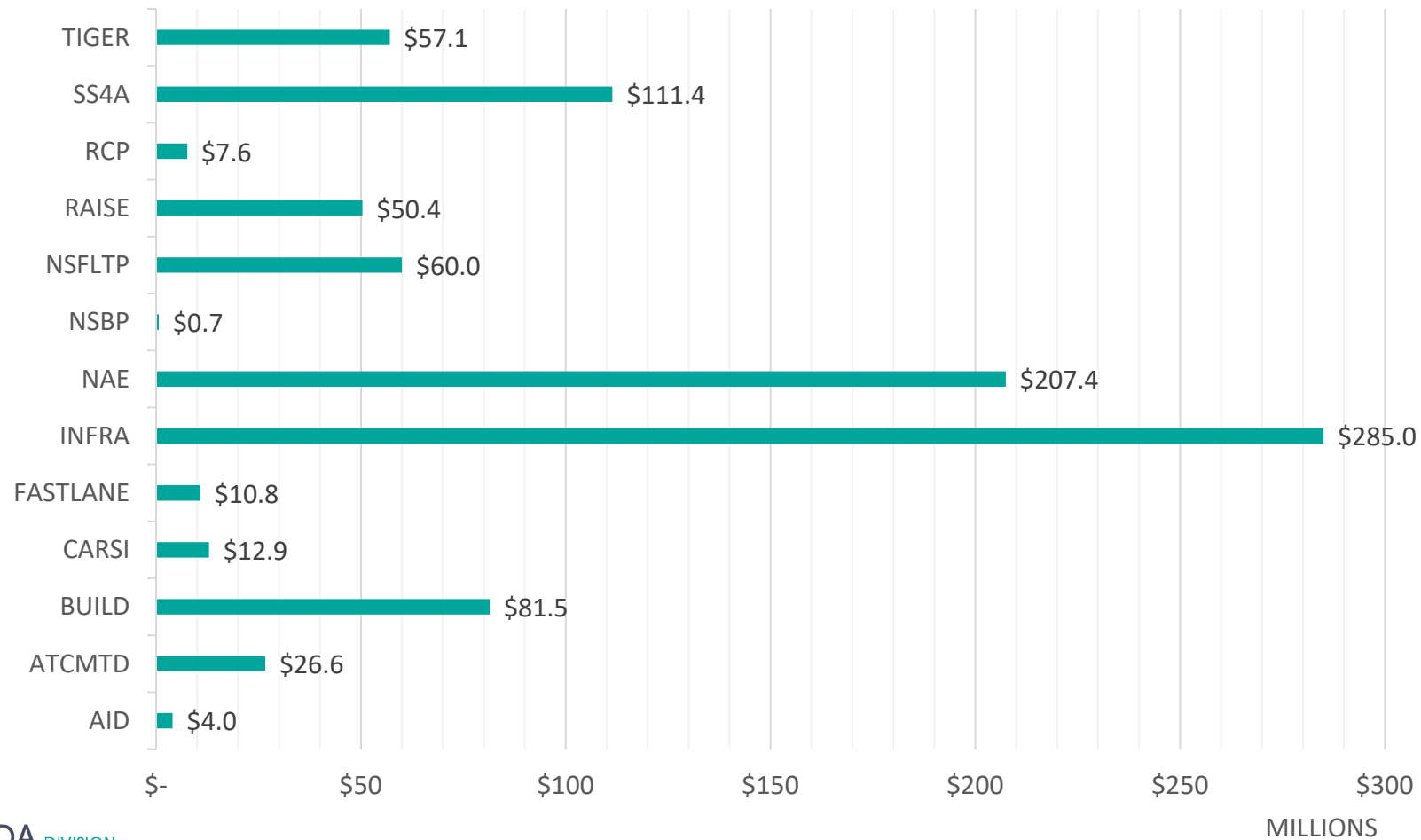


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Funds Awarded by Program
