3. Was the surface easy to walk on?

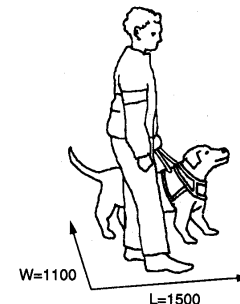
- Yes Some problems:

4. Were the curb ramps easy to use?

- Yes Some problems:
- Curb ramps were not provided
 - Curb ramps needed repair
 - Puddles or debris collected at the bottom of the curb ramp
 - Detectable warnings were not provided

 - Extreme street slope made entering or leaving the curb ramp difficult
 - Obstacle such as poles or gratings blocked the curb ramps

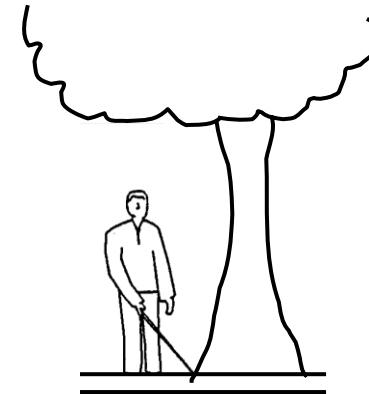
