What is "Plain Language" – Seven musts:

1. Instead of using "shall", use:

- "must" for an obligation,
- "must not" for a prohibition,
- "may" for a discretionary action, and
- "should" for a recommendation.



What is "Plain Language" – Seven musts:

- 2. Active Voice 3. Present Tense 4. Avoid Commas
- 5. Short sentences 6. Omit unnecessary words
- 7. Place "only" or "always" next to word modified

Old: Throughout this design process, quality control will be exercised by those responsible for the engineering design and plans preparation activities by having a plan-do-check routine for each <u>and every</u> significant task or operation.

New: Exercise quality control throughout the design process by conducting a plan-do-check routine for each significant task.
