Re: Page 3 - 1st para.- The proposal requiring DRB members to disclose all Boards the member is currently serving on appears to be positioning the Department to control whom may serve on Dispute Review Boards. I think the Contractor should be able to select someone they feel is best qualified. This proposal should be opposed by the industry.

Page 4 - 8-3.7.4 - The proposed last sentence should not be added. The Board does not control the execution of the three party agreement. The Department is the last one to sign and sometimes this takes months to get the authorized person and Dept. attorney to sign-off. The Board is the one who will suffer.
