My only comment is on the seven days. I have projects that require all the pipe to be videoed. If the contractor request at that time for the inspection you can't even view all the pipe video in seven days. We also have several hundred inlets and structures. We would of course inspect structures as we go, but just these few items would be pushing it to do in seven days. We always do our inspections when requested in a timely manner, but it could get tough if you had a contractor that wanted to push the time issue. Typically we get the pipe video all at one time from the contractor.
