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Comments: (12-12-11) The first paragraph and subsection 'a' describe the sheeting as 'types', but subsection 'b' uses the descriptive definition instead of the 'type'. Suggest using 'type' in all circumstances.

Response: The wording has been revised in subsection “b”.

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Comments: (12-15-11) There is no reference in 994-1.2 (7-10) to the ASTM D-4956 Type XI sheeting. Up to now, this sheeting has only been included within our Type VII(Special)sheeting category. As to the legends for overhead signs shall use only microprismatic sheeting, a more definitive definition needs to be given. If the intention is to exclude a beaded type of sheeting product, why not just say that. The QPL currently does not make that differentiation for Type 3 sheeting.

Response: You are correct. I will submit a specification change for 994-1.2 and 994-2 to include Type XI sheeting. If we use beaded it would be confusing since beaded material is allowed for green background. No Change Made..
