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Comments: (6-4-12)

I recommend that you add “longitudinal” in front of pavement markings at the highlighted locations below:

701-7 Observation Period.

*Longitudinal P*pavement markings are subject to a 180- day observation period under normal traffic. The observation period will begin with the satisfactory completion and acceptance of the pavement marking work.

The **longitudinal** pavement markings shall show no signs of failure due to blistering, excessive cracking, chipping, discoloration, poor adhesion to the pavement, loss of reflectivity or vehicular damage. The retroreflectivity shall meet the initial requirements of 701-4.4. The Department reserves the right to check the color and retroreflectivity anytime prior to the end of the observation period.

Replace, at no expense to the Department, any **longitudinal** pavement markings that do not perform satisfactorily under traffic during the 180- day observation period.
